

Go to a Phillies game and Strike Out Hunger

Rotary Strike Out Hunger is Back - Raising Money for Polio Plus

The Phillies and Rotary to Celebrate the 36th Anniversary of Strike-Out Hunger

Strike-Out Hunger is an annual event now involving over 200 Rotary Clubs in six Rotary Districts from PA, NJ, DE and MD. The 36th Annual Game will be held on August 8, 2023 at 6:40 pm, at Citizens Bank Park as the Philadelphia Phillies play the Washington Nationals. The money raised from this event will go for the inoculation of children against Polio and other childhood diseases. Strike-Out Hunger began 39 years ago as a vision of Dr. Jacob Neufeld, a 23-year-old Rotarian from Mount Laurel. At the time, Polio struck 1,000 children worldwide every day (365 days X 1,000= 365,000 children a year). Because of Rotary, less than 100 children were stricken with Polio last year. With your support by next year, the world could be Polio free.

After Strike-Out Hunger's initial success, it was adopted as an annual event by Neil Garber, the Rotary District Governor of South Jersey. He continued as the Regional Director for the next 20 years, collecting many thousands of pounds of food and raising over \$500,000 for Polio eradication. After Neil's sudden death, his assistant, Marvin Axler from the Garden State Rotary Club of Cherry Hill stepped up. He expanded the event to what it is today.

In 2007, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation entered the fight against Polio with a \$100 million matching grant. Rotarians exceeded the challenge and the Gates Foundation continued increasing the matching grant, reaching \$355 million by June 30, 2012. Rotary is now in its final push to end Polio. By 2016, Strike-Out Hunger had raised over \$1 Million. That translates to the inoculation of around 1.5 million children that have been spared the possibility of death or a crippled life.

This year, the Phillies will donate approx.50% of the ticket price for every one sold by Rotarians. The Gates Foundation will, also match the money raised for the fight against Polio. For Ticket information, Call or Email Marvin Axler (856) 665-6555 marvin@cmi-direct.com.

Your club will earn community service credit by participating. Using the district/club code when ordering will ensure that your club gets the credit for the funds raised by your ticket sales. Those funds will be deposited into the foundation and your club decides how those funds are spent (hopefully towards Polo+) but can be set aside for your club's use. We would be happy to have a knowledgeable representative come to your meeting to explain this and answer questions. Just let us know.


