

ELIZABETHTOWN MILITARY BANNER PROGRAM

The Elizabethtown Lions Club is proud to announce the Elizabethtown Area Military Banner Program. The program serves to recognize men and women who have served or are currently serving our country in any branch of the military.

The banners measure 30" wide; 60" tall and are produced by the Street Décor Company on their Custom MainStreet Digital Fabric. Each banner will honor a specific military veteran and include his or her picture, branch of service and years of service on each side. The cost of a banner and the hanging hardware is \$250.00.

The process to follow for a banner to be displayed on a utility pole in or around the Elizabethtown area is:

- Complete the Application Form. [If you have any questions about completing the form, please contact one of the Lions listed below].

 - Lion Brian 717-808-7263
- 2. Mail the form and payment to:
 - Elizabethtown Lions Club P.O. Box 5 Euzabethtown, Pa. 17022
- 3. Email a PDF Photo (high-resolution jpeg is desired) to EtownLionsClub@gmail.com
- 4. The Lions Club will review the form, etc., and notify you by email or phone if it is acceptable.
- 5. The Lions Club will forward each request to Street Décor. The requests will be sent out on a first come first serve basis. The intent is to have batches of 20 to 30 requests sent out at a time. [If there is a delay in sending a request while waiting to accumulate a batch, the Lions Club will notify you]
- The Lions Club will receive an email from Street Décor with your proof for you to review and approve. When
 approved the Lions Club will notify Street Décor to produce your banner.
- All completed banners will be shipped to the Lions Club.
- 8. You will receive an email or phone call from the Lions Club when we receive your banner.
- 9. The Lions Club will schedule a time to hang the banner.
- 10. You will be notified by email or phone once your banner is on display and where it is displayed.


We are so excited to bring all of the local amazing Rotary organizations together for a day of fun at a Barnstormers game! The day will include the following:
