



HOWEVER, THE GOOD NEWS is that the number of cases annually are small and the war on Polio is being won! THE BAD NEWS is that until Polio is eradicated, the virus is only a plane ride away. This has been a huge undertaking by Rotary and today other organizations around the world have joined the fight. WHEN POLIO is eradicated, it will be only the second disease to be eradicated from the face of the earth since Small Pox.
