

from Poliomyelitis as Herein Limited and Provided.

This policy provides insurance against loss by reason of expense incurred by the Insured and the members of the Insured's family as herein defined (all of whom including the Insured are herein called the Family) and resulting from Poliomyelitis, to the extent herein limited and provided.

"Members of the Insured's family," as used in this policy means the spouse of the Insured and the unmarried child or children of the Insured who are under 18 years of age.

This policy is issued in consideration of payment in advance of the term premium stated in the Schedule which includes premium for attached riders, if any. After taking effect this policy shall remain in force until the first renewal premium due date. Unless renewed, as hereinafter provided, this policy shall terminate at the expiration of the period for which the premium has been paid. All periods of insurance shall begin and end at 12 o'clock noon, Standard Time, at the place where the Insured resides.

EXPENSE PAYABLE

When any member of the Family shall, by reason of Poliomyelitis, first manifest itself after the effective date of this policy, require treatment commencing while this policy is in force as to such member, the Company will pay for the following items of expense actually incurred thereafter within three years after the date of the first treatment, not to exceed in aggregate the Limit of Expense Payable stated in the Schedule as to any one member of the Family:

1. HOSPITAL CARE—Hospital board and room, miscellaneous hospital supplies including drugs, medicines, physiotherapy and rental of necessary braces, splints, or wheel chairs.
2. IRON LUNG—Rental of iron lung or other similar mechanical equipment.
3. MEDICAL CARE—The services of legally qualified physicians, osteopaths or physiotherapists.
4. NURSING CARE—The services of licensed or graduate nurses or members of the Insured's family.
5. TRANSPORTATION—Transportation by aircraft, by railroad from the place where the member of the Family is at the time Poliomyelitis first manifests itself, to a hospital or a sanitarium qualified to provide special Poliomyelitis treatment.
6. AMBULANCE SERVICE—The reasonable expense incurred by ambulance service to or from the hospital.
7. BOARD AND LODGING—The reasonable expense incurred by board and lodging by any one member of the Family who, during the period of hospital confinement and because of the hospital confinement for the treatment of Poliomyelitis of any other member of the Family, leaves his regular domicile in order to be near the place of confinement.

STANDARD PROVISIONS

1. This policy includes the endorsements and attached papers, if any, and contains the entire contract of insurance. No reduction shall be made in any indemnity herein provided by reason of change in the occupation of the Insured or by reason of his doing any act or thing pertaining to any other occupation.
2. No statement made by the applicant for insurance not included herein shall avoid the policy or be used in any legal proceeding hereunder. No agent has authority to change this policy or to waive any of its provisions. No change in this policy shall be valid unless approved by an executive officer of the Company and such approval be endorsed hereon.
3. If default be made in the payment of the stated premium for this policy, the subsequent acceptance of a premium by the Company or by any of its duly authorized agents shall reinstate the policy but only to cover such sickness as may begin more than ten days after the date of such acceptance.
4. Written notice of sickness on which claim may be based must be given to the Company within ten days after the commencement of the disability from such sickness.
5. Such notice given by or in behalf of the Insured or beneficiary, as the case may be, to the Company at its Home Office in Columbus, Ohio, or to any authorized agent of the Company, with particulars sufficient to identify the Insured shall be deemed to be notice to the Company. Failure to give notice within the time provided in this policy shall not invalidate any claim if it shall be shown not to have been reasonably possible to give such notice and that notice was given as soon as was reasonably possible.

This Policy Is Renewable at the Option of the Company Only

On the left is an insurance policy that was purchased in 1951. William's first child was born in March of that year and Polio was a concern to many parents in the United States as well as around the world. The policy starts by saying; This policy provides Insurance against loss by reason of expense incurred by the Insured and the members of the Insured's family as herein defined ... and resulting from Poliomyelitis: ... POLIO

YES POLIO WAS REAL ... and STILL IS! Just see the photos at the bottom of the page. Children in a few countries are exposed to the virus. HOWEVER, THE GOOD NEWS is that the number of cases annually are small and the war on Polio is being won! THE BAD NEWS is that until Polio is eradicated, the virus is only a plane ride away. This has been a huge undertaking by Rotary and today other organizations around the world have joined the fight.

WHEN POLIO is eradicated, it will be only the second disease to be eradicated from the face of the earth since Small Pox.

It isn't over ... until it's over!

The following item of expense payable is added: BRACES—the cost, not to exceed \$100.00, of braces authorized by a legally qualified physician, osteopath or physiotherapist.

The policy period paid for by any premium due May 1, 1955 or later is three years.
