Our Community

Paarl is located approximately 60km from Cape Town in the heart of the Cape Winelands in South Africa. The town has a population of 305,281 people and due to the growth of the Mbekweni township it is now a de facto urban unit with Wellington within the Drakenstein municipal borders covering 1538 km². The town is known for its scenic environment, viticulture and fruit-growing heritage.

Paarl is a haven for tourists, but can be a tough environment for the poor.

The Opportunity

Due to political turmoil, a stagnant economy and an exceptionally high unemployment figure in excess of 30%, our community is locked in poverty. According to the 2022/27 Integrated Development Plan of the Drakenstein Municipality, there are now 41 Informal Settlements with 11755 Households without Income. Providing sufficient education is of major concern. Drug and alcohol abuse is a serious challenge leading to violence, bullying, teenage pregnancies and the abandonment of many babies. The winters are cold and wet, creating a need for shelter, blankets and food.

We do however know that throughout history, Paarlites who have managed to overcome these challenges have excelled in becoming some of the continent's top leaders in business as well as on the sports field.

Current Investments

NORSA

Norsa provides nutritional support, educational support, psycho-social support, foster care, early childhood development as well as offering an after-school training service. The organisation reaches out to more than 4000 families.

BUTTERFLY HOUSE

A pre-school and after school care centre for children from the poverty and violence stricken informal settlement of Fairyland.



NUWEDRIF EDUCATION TRUST

An educational facility and support system for the children of farmworkers – from pre-school to after-school age - in this wine producing community.

The drop-out rate among these children is exceptionally high, and the programme is focused to try and break this cycle of poverty.

EYE TESTS

Free eye tests are provided at multiple facilities and hundreds of spectacles have been supplied to children in need. This ongoing project has proven to be a great success in improving children's learning abilities

FEEDING SCHEMES

The establishment and support of numerous soup kitchens and other feeding schemes with organisations who continue to support the needs of the community on a daily basis.



MBEKO ECO CLUB

In partnership with Paarl Mountain Nature Reserve personnel and youth from the Mbekweni community, we have embarked on an environment programme to harvest seeds and re-establish indigenous trees on Paarl Mountain.

SPORTS FACILITIES

Supporting locally organised sports clubs to keep youth off the streets. We have had great success with a kickboxing club that presents ant-bullying courses at schools. Wrestling, martial arts, cricket clubs and athletics clubs also prove to be effective in motivating vulnerable youth.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Every year a large group of youth leaders from the local schools are sponsored to attend a week's course in leadership training at an offsite venue in our area. These events are coordinated by District 9350 and we would like to extend this to more youth candidates from within the Drakenstein municipal borders.
