The Editor

Iceland knows how to stop teen substance abuse but the rest of the world isn’t listening

This interesting article is about the prevention of drug use in children and adolescents. The approach is somewhat revolutionary and had been successfully applied in a test run in the USA, and a country-wide application in Iceland.

Emma Young, the author of the article, tracks the journey of Denver’s Metropolitan State University Psychology Professor Harvey Milkman, as he investigated the reasons for addiction among teenagers and looked for ways to prevent the initiation of drug use. The conventional educational models of orientating teenagers and enforced withdrawal were not working. Teens did not respond positively nor were they interested in listening. After good results in the USA Milkman’s model was applied to a larger population group in Iceland. This article tells the story of the development of his model and its successful outcome.

Previous Meeting

Minutes of the meeting on 18 January 2017

Sergeant Jenny Howard opened the meeting.

President Chris welcomed our guests for the evening our guest speaker André Odendaal and his wife Zohra, Garth and Zudy Johnson, Abe Oliver (Special Guest).

SPEAKER:

Shân introduced our guest speaker Professor André Odendaal and read part of his comprehensive CV. André who is an historian has a PhD in history from Cambridge University and is an author of 10 books. He played first class cricket for Boland, Western Province, Transvaal and for Cambridge University. He joined the non-racial SACOS during the apartheid years and recently was the CEO of Western Province Cricket. He spoke about his latest book “Cricket and Conquest – The History of South African Cricket Retold”

Volume 1 for the period 1795-1914 is in the shops and members purchased the whole box of books that André brought along. This certainly shows that his presentation and the book’s message tugged the heart strings of many of us and was extremely informative.

André gave us a number of excellent examples of how skewed the beliefs and actions of white colonial cricket administrators were in the in the late 1880’s to 1890’s towards Black, so called Malay cricket clubs and highly talented individual cricketers. He gave us some bowling and batting statistics of a few outstanding performers such as Robert Grendon & Krom Hendricks who played for the “South African Malay team” against visiting English test and county sides, but never played for South Africa. Hendricks was rated by both a white South African Test batsman and an experienced English county player while watching him and said at the time that Krom was by far the finest fast bowler in South Africa.

André explained that both the British military tradition of playing cricket as a compulsory discipline builder, linked with the belief by a number of colonials, such as William Milton that cricket was an exclusive game for Anglo Saxons and the elite class kept cricket segregated in the Western Cape mainly in the Southern Suburbs. Milton was the secretary of WPCC at the time and would not even allow the club to play against clubs out of the Southern Suburbs let alone against other cultures and racial groups. This was just the start of many years of prejudice.

The interest from members was evident by the many questions that were asked both before and after dinner. Hats off to Mike Young & his team for inviting such an excellent speaker who with his 3 co-authors have spent 40 years researching for the truth about cricket in South Africa!
