Previous Meeting

Minutes of the Business Meeting on 28 August 2017 Scribe: Henry Campbell

Sergeant Richard H called on Pres. Graham who welcomed visitors from the Rotary Club of Waterfront (RCW). President Siham Boda of RCW introduced the members from RCW viz. Dirk Hoffman, Maryka van Wyk, Sue Truter, Hans Stampfi, Hannarie Wenhold, Alfons Gainsberger, Jannice Halliford, Piet Postema and Vic Hamaty.

Andy I read the Object of Rotary and Wybe M called for a toast to R.I. and said Grace.

Stirrer's Spoon is still with Menno dW. Heidi A won the wine raffle.

Membership Report – Shân B advised that there is a potential member form Gabon. The membership committee had a fireside chat with new members last week. There are now 59 members and 2 honorary members in the Club.

Community Services Report – Corrine H informed the meeting that the Community Services budget for the year is R305 000. A third of this is committed to Early Childhood Development. One-to-One project would get R20 000.

Other beneficiaries are Mandela 67h food parcels, Dragon Boat race, Books of the World, Ethemblethu School and Lawrence House-Woodstock. There are also a number of small projects receiving less than R5k each.

Youth Service – Vanessa R reported that the Club was overseeing 3 Earlyact clubs and 6 interact clubs. The Earlyact clubs were getting reading support- with prizes. Seventy learners assisted at the One-on-One project. Twelve students would be sponsored to the RYLA camp. Our Club would cosponsor a long-term student from Brazil and a short-term student to Japan and one from Japan.

Vocation and International – Lucian P advised that although the available budget for this portfolio is R250k, he needs R350k and he has some ideas for raising the extra funds. Most of the bursaries would over time be awarded to persons studying in a technical field. One bursary has been awarded while two more are being considered.

Our Club has been approached to host a visiting group of 6 couples from Sweden during October/November. Tony vdL offered to champion the visit. It was noted that the Club had decided to limit a hosting period to a maximum of three nights.

Entrepreneurship – Andy I informed the meeting that the aims of this portfolio is to foster partnerships, support education, work with the False Bay College Incubator (FBCI) and mentor young entrepreneurs. Funds would be made available to provide 5 bursaries and prizes to the FBCI. The Club has 12 mentors assisting the FBCI.

Funds would also be given to grow the Pocket Money Market. An application for a District Grant has been prepared, collaborating with the RCW. Bill H encouraged more members to mentor at the FBCI.

Public Relations – Regine 1R informed the meeting that publicity had been given to the E-Club launch and the Masakhane facility. Tree planting on 1/09 would be covered. Protocols for publishing and responses on social media were being developed. Opinions of the Club members on the 'Rotary Reputation' would be canvassed.

Club Service – Paul S asked members to use their names and surnames in any correspondence and to allow for e-mail delivery time on a Monday morning as he is only available till 10:00am.

Treasurer – Peter I stated that there is some R1.5 million in the bank, most of which is committed to specific projects. The Club anticipates a funds income of some R800 000 for the year from the CT Cycle Tour, CT Marathon and the Stellenbosch Cycle Tour.

Corporate Social Investment – John W reported that the Masakhane facility and the Steenberg music room had been completed. The latter would be opened on Friday 1/09. Although there are many projects that could be undertaken, funding is not available. Discussions are ongoing with PEMBEV and MEDICOR.

Cycle Tours – Jenny H reminded the meeting that the cycle tour projects were the main source of funding to the Club and required much manpower to marshal the course and provide necessary logistics.

Cape Town Marathon – Wybe M advised that now that the marathon had been granted gold status the race would be run with full road closure. This required more marshals and more cut-off points in order for roads to be opened as soon as possible. Rochelle M who is in charge of sourcing and allocating marshals appealed to members to assist in finding another 120 marshals. Other responsibilities include sector marshals, their assistants and the sweeps.

Early Childhood Development – Geraldine N who is heading up the portfolio informed the meeting that we would be partnering with RCW on projects in Langa where 7000 kids are in need of preschool development. Of these only 2000 are presently in some form of pre-school. The project entails a survey of existing facilities, structures at 44 centres – all for about R15m. There are several corporate businesses and international Rotary Clubs wanting to partner in the project.

Regine IR encouraged members to support the Khayelitsha Institution?/Parletones fundraiser. She informed the meeting that her business has positions available for paid research interns and invited members to put forward suitable candidates.

President Graham reminded members that the DG would be visiting next week. He thanked RCW for their visit.

Happy Rands were collected and the meeting was closed.


