A bit of the past became part of downtown Mankato's future a few weeks ago with the addition of an old-style public clock to the new grand lawn in front of the Mankato



Intergovernmental Center, courtesy of the Greater Mankato Rotary Club. The clock has long been on the city's wish list and became a higher priority when plans surfaced to turn the parking area between the government building and the civic center into a grass-filled public square that would serve as a gathering spot and home to free summer concerts.

The clock is nearly 17 feet tall, is backlit with LED lighting that automatically comes on at dusk and is synchronized with the atomic clock of the U.S. Naval Observatory — the official timekeeper of the United States.
