
November 10, 2015: Prior Lake Rotary Club's Foundation Event



Joe Dols, President, presented Dr. Scott with an honorary membership to the Prior Lake Rotary Club.

The slide shown on the above states: We have averted 10 million cases of polio 1.5 million deaths averted. We already have a success story. In a few months we will have a triumphant story to tell and we will have kept our promise to the children of the world.

The **Prior Lake Rotary Club** held a Rotary Foundation event to celebrate their achievements to Polio by inviting **Dr. Robert Scott, Past Rotary International Director and Rotary International Polio Chair** to give the keynote. His speech was enlightening and interesting. He talked about Rotary's successes in the eradication of polio, but also about the issues in regards to getting the job completed. His explanation of the involvement of partners including governments and other organizations proves our collaboration efforts.



Another initiative Dr. Scott discussed included the efforts to support the families of the health care workers who were killed in the process of finding and delivering vaccine to children. These people were often the main providers for their families. The Heroes program is a highly successful and visible program for Rotary and provides encouragement to those on the front lines in the countries that are still endemic.

South St. Paul/Inver Grove Heights Rotary;

District Grant Title: Updating Early Childhood Hearing Screening Practices Using Otoacoustic Emissions Technology

The purpose of this project was to fund the purchase of Otoacoustic Emissions hearing screening equipment that enables children served by the Inver Grove Heights




Community Schools Early Childhood Special Education Program to receive high quality, up-to-date hearing screenings. This will ensure that each child's hearing health and related development needs are met. It will increase the capacity of the school program to conduct hearing screenings to benefit 100's of children in the years ahead.

About thirty percent of the club members participated in the research to review and

select the project. Rotarians received a presentation last week and the equipment was tested on some of them.

The cost of the project was \$5970.00. South St. Paul/Inver Grove Heights Rotary partnered with West St. Paul Rotary to receive the grant.

Northfield Rotary Club



The Friends of Way Park in collaboration with the Northfield Rotary Club, local music educators, and the City of Northfield are building an outdoor musical plaza. The total Cost of the project is \$42,515.

The Rotary Foundation grant application requested \$12,000, which is a match from the sponsoring club and other district clubs. The project is to purchase instruments like the contrabass chimes, the swirl, the marimba, the Pegasus and the tuned drums. This concept is becoming well known in many cities. The idea is to provide

opportunities for families to spend time in the park and have creative opportunities. "Grandma can play with toddler and mom and dad, brothers and sisters of multiple ages and skill sets can play together without any knowledge and/or training, due to the special tuning.
