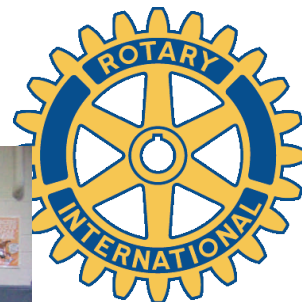

Jim Mortimer conducted his last board meeting. Tod Wilcock noted and we all concurred that Jim did a great job.

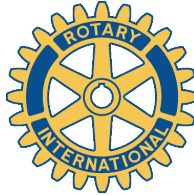
- It was noted that Randy Seneway will chair the community day booth.
