A Message From the President

Fellow McMurray Rotarians:

I want to thank all of you for your participation in the numerous projects and activities we have been involved in the past weeks and months in keeping with this year's Rotary Theme of "Building Communities and Bridging Continents."

Our participation, along with other clubs in District 7330, in the Strike-Out-Hunger event in August raised \$1,431.00 for the Washington County Food Bank. We were able to provide three Shelter Boxes to be used when disaster strikes some underserved area of the world. The Fishing Derby was a fun and successful event with a high turnout of children and Rotarians. Our "Buy One Get One Free" Water Filter project continues to be successful with many of you already having signed up for one or more. Your contribution helps give children all over the world the gift of clean drinking water.

Polio is down, but not yet defeated. A deadly outbreak in Congo has killed 97 people among over 200 reported cases. Rotary is providing a total of \$500,000.00 in emergency grants to WHO and UNICEF for immediate polio immunization efforts throughout the country. On a positive note, as of November 18, 2010, Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge has raised \$153,909,000. Rotary's US\$200 Million Challenge is the Rotary Foundation's response to the two grants totaling \$355 million from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to help eradicate polio. Every dollar given to Polio Plus will be counted toward the \$200 million match, which must be completed by 30 June 2012. Only \$46,000.000 left to reach our goal. Donate now to help Rotary achieve a polio-free world.

We have also seen a busy schedule with community service activities. During the month of November we were able to, in collaboration with some local churches and other service organizations, help a local long-term resident keep his home. We provided the necessary work to fix his deck, front yard steps, tear down an old playhouse, cut down some trees, clean up debris in the yard, etc. to comply with his home insurance company's requirements. We have provided dictionaries to third graders in the Peters Township School District, gave \$2,000.00 towards a dishwasher for the Venetia Community Center thanks to a District Simplified Grant, donated \$2,000.00 to Operation Safety Net to help obtain socks, gloves, hats, blankets and sleeping bags for the homeless, and more recently, participated in a Habitat for Humanity project.

The Interact Club in the High School sponsored by our Rotary Club is up and running. They have elected their officers and with a membership of over 25 students have already held a successful blood drive collecting 50 units of blood. Many other projects are in the pipeline ready to be implemented by these very enthusiastic and community-minded young boys and girls.


