Polio Plus \$200 Million Challenge

At our Club Assembly meeting in March, Al DeLucia spoke to us about the Polio Plus initiative and how our club participates. An impromptu passing of the donation can gathered \$347 which brings us to a grand total of \$1447. Some of the ideas that were generated to help us reach our club's 2011 goal of \$2000 are:

From 04/14 until 06/23 all proceeds from each meeting's 50/50 will go to the Polio Plus Fund. We will have donation cans at each meeting.

50% of net proceeds from the Health Awareness Event will go to the Polio Plus Fund. We will also have donation cans and signs for Polio Plus at the Health Awareness Event.

Ask the Interact Club to conduct a penny drive or some other type of fundraiser at the high school to support Polio Plus.

Goal of \$25 per member contribution to the Polio Plus Campaign. Tony will be passing around a sign up sheet to have this billed to you as part of your Rotary bill. If you want to be billed for it just sign up. If you want the amount to be more than \$25 that's OK too.

If any members have any other ideas let Al or Tony know.

Here are some of the creative ways that other Rotarians around the world are raising money and contributing to the Polio Plus Challenge:

The Concert to End Polio, which brought together Rotarians and friends of Rotary in Chicago on March 7, raised more than \$125,000 toward Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge. Violin virtuoso Itzhak Perlman and members of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, led by guest conductor James DePreist, performed before a packed audience at Symphony Center.

Xaver Hausner and Oliver Macindoe cycled more than 2,000 miles across New Zealand, raising about \$37,000 for Rotary's challenge, with the support of Rotarians and others. Hausner was a 2009-10 Rotary Scholar at Victoria University in Wellington, New Zealand, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Passau, Germany.

Thirty-five farmers in Ohio, USA, teamed up with the Rotary Club of Urbana to show that corn can be used to fight polio as well as hunger. They each donated the gross income from one acre of their 2010 harvest to Rotary's challenge, raising more than \$23,600.


