This year, the event was held at the beautiful new West Penn Allegheny Health System building on Rt. 19. In addition to the traditional blood testing, complimentary screenings were done for hearing, glaucoma, blood pressure and body mass index. Several organizations set up booths to distribute information including the National Liver Foundation, the Ovarian Cancer Foundation, the nutrition department, and Cancer Care—Radiation Therapy. Steve set up the Shelter Box tent with all of the contents for everyone to take a "tour." Special guests for the day included LPGA star, Missie Berteotti who gave complimentary golf swing assessments and tips, and Representative Tim Murphy, who stopped by for a visit. This was also our first joint project with the Interact Students who held a Chinese Auction and 50/50 to help raise money for their many projects. Many members volunteered their time to help facilitate the registration and processing of the blood testing candidates as well as guide visitors through the booths and exhibits. 


