Club Happenings

Club member Dr. Steve Morreale works with Dr. Jim Withers and the organization Operation Safety Net which provides medical services to homeless people. He presented the club with a challenge to purchase 100 pairs of boots for the people that he works with in the Pittsburgh area. Gander Mountain supplies the heavy winter boots at a reduced price of \$30 for women's and \$35 for men's. Steve started us off with a donation of \$1050 for 30 pairs, the board authorized another \$1000, and the club was challenged with coming up with another \$1000 to meet the goal. The response was immediate and overwhelming. Through everyone's generosity to date we collected over \$1600. Steve and Jamison made arrangements to pur-

chase and deliver 100 pairs of boots and the rest of the funds will be used to purchase another much needed shipment.

Dr. Steve sent me this touching thank you...

These boots serve a pragmatic purpose in reducing suffering and especially preventing limb threatening frostbite. They also serve as an even more powerful token of trust for the establishment of a transformative continuity relationship built on the rapport between a homeless person and those individuals who serve the homeless population with a very specialized professional outreach program comprised of a cadre of many interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary teams who are all skilled and compassionate as Street Medicine volunteers and outreach service partners.

Interact Update

On Sunday December 2nd members of the Rotary Club

met up with members of the Interact Club to work on a Barn Project. In Stride Therapeutic Riding organization in Venetia provides horse riding lessons for children with physical and mental handicaps. Their project involved digging out a dirt and concrete slab floor to prepare it to eventually be



poured with concrete to create a waiting room for parents. In Stride will be one of our upcoming programs to talks about the work that they do. The Interact Club has also completed three blood drives, they continue to tutor and be playground buddies for students at Pleasant Valley Elementary, they donated lettuce grown in their hydroponic garden to the Food Pantry, they adopted 5 local families and provided gifts and a Christmas dinner, and they work with Community Action Southwest to help families in a program titled "Getting Ahead in a Get By World." They are planning another Valentine's Day trip to the WPA School for the blind and their 2nd Annual Walk for Autism in the spring.
