Rotary <u>www.myrotary.org</u> brings together a global network of volunteers who dedicate their time and talent to tackle the world's most pressing humanitarian challenges. Rotary connects 1.2 million members from more than 200 countries and geographical areas. Their work impacts lives at both the local and international levels, from helping families in need in their own communities to working toward a polio-free world.

## **Membership Snapshot**

**Who:** Rotary brings together the kind of people who step forward to take on important issues for local communities worldwide. Rotary members hail from a range of professional backgrounds; doctors, artists, small business owners and executives all call themselves Rotarians. Rotary connects these unique perspectives, and helps leverage its members' expertise to improve lives everywhere.

**Where:** From Haiti and Greenland to Nigeria and Singapore, Rotary unites a truly diverse set of leaders from across the world. Currently, the largest number of clubs comes from the United States, India, Japan and Brazil. The fastest growing Rotary regions include Southeast Asia and Africa.

**What:** Rotarians contribute their time, energy and passion to sustainable, long-term projects in local communities across the globe. Projects focus on important issues like peace and conflict resolution, disease prevention and treatment, water and sanitation, maternal and child health, basic education and literacy and economic and community development.

The Rotary Foundation: The Rotary Foundation transforms donations from Rotarians and other friends of Rotary into service projects that change lives both close to home and around the world. Our 35,000 clubs carry out sustainable service projects that support our six causes. With donations like yours, we've wiped out 99.9 percent of all polio cases. Your donation also trains future peacemakers, supports clean water, and strengthens local economies. During the past 100 years, the Foundation has spent \$3 billion on life-changing, sustainable projects. **Polio Eradication:** Rotary is close to eliminating the second human disease in history after smallpox, with a 99.9 percent reduction in polio cases worldwide since 1985, when Rotary launched its Polio Plus program. In 1988, Rotary spearheaded the creation of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative with the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Polio eradication remains a top Rotary priority. To date, through their gifts to The Rotary Foundation, Rotarians have contributed more than \$1.5 billion and countless volunteer hours to help immunize more than two billion children against polio in 122 countries. As further evidence of how Rotary leverages Foundation donations, Rotary set a goal of raising \$35 million per year through 2018 for polio eradication in order to benefit from a 2 to 1 match by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. <a href="https://www.endpolio.org/">https://www.endpolio.org/</a>

- Purchase a gift for the Sharing Families holiday program (December)
- Donate cash for the Holiday Backpack Program (November)
- Work at Relay for Life spaghetti dinner (Spring)
- Serve as Club President (extensive training provided by District 5960)
- Chair a committee (Membership, Public Relations, Club Service, Foundation)
- Be an active member of a committee or subcommittee
- Serve as Sergeant at Arms, collecting each week's Happy Bucks
- Help with new local and international projects

#### **Financial Obligations**

- Application Fee \$100 per corporation (not designee) or individual membership
- Annual Dues (to be paid quarterly) as follows:
  - o Traditional Individual Membership \$500
  - o Equal to or Under 35/Over 80 Membership \$400
  - Corporate Membership annual dues per member
    - Initial Designee \$500
    - Two Designees \$1,000
    - Three Designees \$1,200
    - Four Designees \$1,600
    - Five Designees \$2,000

# ROTARY CLUB OF RIVER FALLS Membership Types

The goal of implementing a variety of membership categories is to positively impact membership trends and the club's overall effectiveness by increasing the club's ability to attract and retain a qualified and diverse population base within the community. These membership types are designed to provide value in the following areas:

#### Increase

- Club membership recruitment and retention
- Support to the Rotary Foundation (program participation and fundraising)
- Successful service projects (community and international)

#### **Improve**

- Leadership and engagement opportunities for members
- Participation in club activities
- Gender balance in the clubs' membership
- Overall diversity within the club's membership

#### **Traditional Individual**

This membership type applies to standard individual representation.

### Equal to or Under 35/Over 80

This membership type is designed to attract younger members as well as to retain older members who are likely retired; the club benefits from having a more diversified age group.

### **Corporate**

This membership type is designed for a business organization that benefits from having multiple members involved in Rotary. Following an established approval process, a business may then appoint up to five (5) individuals to be its designees, one of whom must be a member of that entity's senior executive group; the others can be managerial individuals employed full time by the eligible corporation. Each individual designee is encouraged to attend club meetings, serve on committees, vote on club matters, serve as club officers, etc. that is consistent with the expectations of a traditional member. The entity may change designees via notification to the Club President, so long as one is a member of the eligible corporation's senior executive group.



# ROTARY CLUB OF RIVER FALLS Introductory Talks

All new members are expected to give a talk at a weekly meeting to introduce themselves to the club. This is a great opportunity for members of the club get to know you better.

- Talk about where you came from, your educational background, places you have lived and worked, a bit about your spouse/significant other and children, what your hobbies and interests are, etc.
- Talk about your career path. What steps and/or missteps did you take that led you to your career? What are the qualifications or requirements for someone in your career? What things does this type of work regularly entail and what kinds of problems are typically encounter?
- Talk about where you are working and how long you have been in your current position. This is generally only time in the club where a brief commercial for your place of business is permitted.
- Talk about what brought you to River Falls and what you like about the area. Describe what attracted you to Rotary and what about our club most interests you.

Club leadership will work with you to schedule this for a time that works best for you. Please prepare for a presentation – including questions and answers – of 20 minutes. Slides with photos are encouraged.

This is intended to be a brief overview and introduction. If there is a major aspect of your life or career that is of broader interest but would require additional time, please let us know and we will schedule a different time for you to speak to the club on that topic.
