2022 Service to Humanity Scholarship Application

Description

The Waunakee Rotary Foundation awards four \$1,500 Service to Humanity Scholarships annually to graduating high school seniors who provide exemplary volunteer or community service.

Eligibility Requirements

- High school seniors in good standing residing in the Waunakee Community School District graduating in the Spring of 2022 from Waunakee High School, Edgewood High School, Madison Country Day School, St. Ambrose Academy, or a homeschool.
- Seniors awarded scholarships must be registered as full-time students (12 credit hours minimum) at an accredited university, college, or technical school in the Fall of 2022.
- Children of Waunakee Rotary Members are not eligible due to certain tax regulations.
- Scholarship recipients are required to attend a Waunakee Rotary Club meeting held at Rex's Innkeeper on Thursday, June 2, 2022, from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. You and your parents will be our guests during the meeting, and you will be able to introduce yourself to the club members.

Application Requirements

1. Complete the attached Application Form and submit all required documents by 11:59 p.m. on Thursday, April 7, 2022. Incomplete, late, or lost applications will not be considered.
2. Provide one Letter of Recommendation from a volunteer or community service supervisor conforming to the following requirements:
 - a. A PDF file of the Letter of Recommendation on the volunteer or community service organization's letterhead signed by the volunteer or community service supervisor or an email Letter of Recommendation sent directly to rjartz@tds.net from the volunteer or community service supervisor.
 - b. The Letter of Recommendation must be specific to this scholarship. A general college application letter of recommendation will not be accepted.
 - c. The Letter of Recommendation should only describe the applicant's volunteer or community service activities. Do not include descriptions of the applicant's classes taken, grade point average, sports, extra-curricular activities, and employment.
3. On single sided sheets of paper provide the following information typed in 12-point font:
 - a. Write an essay between 500 and 1,500 words describing your volunteer or community service and how it follows the Rotary International Motto, *Service Above Self*. Include your total number of volunteer or community service hours, which may be subject to verification.
 - b. Indicate the university, college or technical school are you planning to attend and your anticipated area of study, major, or career goal.
