
"The Object of Rotary"

Presidents Address

Outgoing President Lyn welcomed everyone to what is her last meeting as President. Lyn said she enjoyed her period as President, was happy with the way the year went and the achievements she and her board had seen, but was ready for the changeover.

Also sad news, Ollie is being transferred down south.

Presentations

Chairman Alan then advised we had two speakers tonight, firstly Ron Degenhart to talk about the Natarbora House Project, and then Neil Andrews on the support we had given to the community during the year.

Natarbora Houses Project

PDG Ron Degenhart spoke about the Natarbora Houses Project in Timor-Leste. This project partners with

SABEH, an NGO that provides outreach medical services to the most remote and disadvantaged people in Timor-Leste, to refurbish two abandoned houses in the village of Natarbora for use by the volunteer medical teams.

He contacted Ron as there was an old Rotary sign on one of the houses. Ron was able to track down the original RAWCS project 141/2005-06, which was managed by the Rotary Club of Bega, NSW. The original project partners were the Rotary Club of Bega, the Rotary Club of Merimbula, and the Rotary Club of Pambula in NSW.

Ron approached the original partners to ascertain their interest in funding the refurbishment. Together with RC Mundingburra, the four clubs raised AUD\$6500. These funds were transferred to SABEH in July 2023.

The intended uses of the houses are:

House 1 – as a residence for visiting volunteer medical teams, and

House 2 – as a palliative care residence.

The works are undertaken by local volunteers. The funds raised are used to purchase the required building materials.

In July 2023 Ron set up a new RAWCS project to raise funds for the refurbishment. The Rotary Club of Mundingburra is the sponsor club of RAWCS Project 3/2023-24. Ron is the project manager and Alan Nelson is the Deputy Manager.

By September 2023 the refurbishment of House 1 was largely complete, and the house is now in use. Works to House 2 are ongoing and further funding is required to complete the refurbishment.

The RAWCS project currently has approximately AUD\$3900 ready to transfer. More funds are required to complete the project. Ron has asked Dr Belo to provide a detailed estimate before further funds can be transferred.

Annual Disbursements

Following Ron Degenhart's short presentation on the Natarbora Houses Project in Timor-Leste Treasurer Neil Andrews came to the lectern to deliver a short presentation about the disbursement of funds raised by the club in the past year.



By way of introduction, Neil explained he had to be adorned with the proper accoutrements which, as you will note from the accompanying picture, was an old military shoulder board adorned with a \$ sign.

Neil proceeded to briefly explain the club's current financial position, the main sources of income and a list of the organisations and worthy causes funds had been dispersed to during the 2023-2024 Rotary year.

While highlighting the total amount of funds dispersed, Neil emphasised that the focus is not so much on the total amount raised but to whom the funds are provided and the associated benefits those organisations derive with the funds.

Neil mentioned two examples were mentioned to reinforce the point. Firstly, provision of funds to purchase and install a defibrillator at Toolakea Beach makes a huge difference to the health, wellbeing and safety of Toolakea Beach residents.

Secondly, provision of funds to purchase safety equipment for the Townsville to Cairns Bike Ride, allows people to more confidently and safely participate in the event which raises funds for the Children's Cancer Institute.

In an effort to help the audience focus on the usually dry and uninteresting topic of 'finance', Neil keep things short and uncomplicated but also cleverly hid a number of clues (10 Movie Titles) throughout his presentation. The more astute in the audience kept a keen eye on

Neil summed up by congratulating members of the club for their contribution to Mundingburra Rotary and fund

raising. Neil's presentation was well received and served to broaden the understanding of members about aspects of club finance and the associated community benefits that generally go unobserved.

PDG Peter Kaye provided a Vote of Thanks to both Ron and Neil for their enlightening presentations.
