Medicine is moving to Precision Medicine to target peoples genes. Until recently the only way to get the information required to enable treatment was by Bone Marrow biopsy.

A mass spectrometer is required however there is only one in Australia and it's in the Alfred Hospital in Melbourne. They have been available since 2010.

Townsville University Hospital is trying to get one but needs a \$1m . First Step is for an ALUMINA machine for \$150k. So they are seeking assistance with fundraising.
