

Michael shared some statistics from 2018 to 2023:

 Homicide and related offences, blackmail and extortion – up 222%

- Firearms offences up 56%
- Prohibited and controlled weapon offences up 10%
- Riot and affray up 180%
- Common assault up33%
- Threatening behaviour up 20%
- Assaulting police/emergency services/authorised officers – up29%
- Aggravated burglary up182%
- And welcomed Fiona to give us her presentation.

Guest Speaker – Fiona Eivers – Crime Stoppers

Fiona then gave us more details about Crime Stoppers QLD. Crime Stoppers is a registered charity and volunteer community organisation. Their purpose is to empower the community with the ability to provide information that supports solving and preventing crime. Their vision is to create a safer community and a safer Australia.
