Neil Andrew said that he had resorted to Google to find out more about Arlin Bosch, our Club speaker giving his "Me Talk". Although Arlin has been a member for a year now, Neil realised he did not know much of his story outside our meetings, his participation in toy making and sausage sizzling.

Medicine hat, Canada, was Arlin's birthplace and love brought him to Townsville – his wife's home town and our gain.

Neil said that he looked forward to hearing more of the story.

### Guest Speaker – Arlin Bosch – Canada

Arlin showed us through his slide presentation that Medicine Hat and Townsville are rather different.

We saw the deep snow of winter and tales of tobogganing to school, snow walking into isolated cabins and the beauty it snow brings to the land.

Medine Hat was developed with the railway. Its natural resources of gas are piped to USA and were until recently used for a large pottery factory using local clay. With the gas deposited there are also dinosaur bones and the town was given the description of having "hell in the basement' by Rudyard Kipling.

His hometown is about the same size as Townsville and Arlin had a very sports-oriented childhood.

He went to College, undertook an apprenticeship in carpentry and spent 20-odd years in building houses and developments in his district. Arlin must have participated in every sport available in his area, mentioning everything from baseball, and knife throwing to rodeo.
