# District Governor – Andrew Gillespie Visit to Townsville Clubs

#### **DG Andrew Gillespie**

96 people representing the nine Townsville clubs attended the combined meeting at Cutheringa Bowls Club last Tuesday.



Andrew spoke well on many topics affecting Rotary and particularly the downward trajectory of membership. There is no magic wand to address the situation other than clubs to work hard to arrest the spiral.

He advised there will be no more Presidential themes with this year being the last.

Zone 8 of which D9560 is a member, is a Regionalisation pilot. Andrew explained how the future might look if Regionalisation is adopted noting Districts will be abolished, District Governors will cease, Assistant Governors replaced by Rotary Community Leaders, and all program heads to be centralised.



To find up-to-date information we are encouraged to visit My Rotary and study online. This was not received well, with the audience expecting up-to-date information to be delivered by Andrew.



Traditional District Conferences will be replaced by one day events to be held at various centres.

Andrew advised there is no DG Partner project this year and encouraged us to support the Foundation instead.

On a sad note, we were advised of the death of Mersu, President Rotary Club of Dili Lafaek, who was a tireless worker for Rotary and his community.

A Go Fund me site will be set up to help support his family. Proceeds from the raffle run on the night will be directed to Mersu's family.
