"The Object of Rotary"


Is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

Vocational Meeting Review (Townsville Court House)

Neil Andrews, accompanied by Phil Gordon, did the registration duties and then welcomed our members and handed over to Karl McKenzie who had arranged the visit for us.

We then proceeded through Security and entered the Court complex.

This is the 3rd Court House in Townsville, bult in 1975.

It houses the Supreme, District, Magistrates, Child/DV, Murrie and QCAT (Qld Civil and Administrative Tribunal) QCAT is Karl's domain.

Should you attend the Court House you usually visit the Magistrates Court first. This Court has a Magistrate, Police Prosecutor and Defence Solicitor.




Matters are heard and you either plead Guilty or proceed to trial.

If you proceed to Trial, it will be either the District Court for matters like Rape and Robbery or the Supreme Court for criminal matters.



The Watch House is down stairs with Defendants bought to the Courts via internal secured passages.

The District and Supreme Courts have a Judge, Jury, Solicitors and Barristers. The Public is able to sit in the Courts and watch proceedings.



The Murrie Court handles matters involving the Indigenous People. Elders also sit with the Judge to assist with Murrie Law and how it is interpreted by the Indigenous Community.



The Child/DV Court handles sensitive matters and is closed to protect the victims involved.

QCAT is Karl's domain and handles Civil and Small Claim matters. Parties usually represent themselves. Following the tour we then adjourned to the Jury Room for pizzas.





Overall a very informative visit. Karl will follow up with a Club discussion on the types on matters he handles and how they are resolved.

Thanks to Karl for arranging this visit and also for the assistance of a very knowledge and skilled person in Errica. A very large and busy place.
