
Is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:


Guest Speaker Segment

A beautifully created PowerPoint narrated by Neil Andrews in character of his ancestor Corp. 2780 William Henry Andrews KIA and buried in the field at 24 years of age. Later moved to Belgium in 1926. William rests beside an unknown soldier.


Neil explained the number of cemeteries for the fallen littered across the Western Front. He gave particular reference to the Villers-Bretonneux Memorial, resting place of 10 000 soldiers. This town has a close connection with Australia due to the work and support WWI Australian Troops provided.



Neil spoke about the reverence that Menin Gate has for Australian troops and the daily service and bugle call each day.



The Club joined Neil in a brief commemoration of those who fought and paid the ultimate sacrifice. This included laying rosemary at our meeting's makeshift Cenotaph, The Last Post and Rouse.
