David spoke on two operational tours in the army

- Operation Stabilize and Tanager Following the departure of Portugal, Indonesia occupied East Timor killing 25% of the population.

1999 UN and 22 countries including Australia led by Major General Peter Cosgrove aided East Timor against the Indonesians

David's team's job was to maintain and protect the airfield.

Supplies came to Darwin from Europe in containers, however, food deteriorated quickly.
