Guest Speaker - Karl McKenzie


Michael Day introduced our guest speaker, member Karl McKenzie from the Townsville Justice Group. Karl commenced by stating that this presentation usually takes an hour so he will be doing an abbreviated version.

Karl spoke about the **Warrior Code**. The Hollywood version of a Warrior is unfortunately misleading. Warrior refers to a level of manhood, not a soldier.




Karl McKenzie

Being a Warrior is all about self-control and maturity. It is ancient wisdom across cultures. Karl referred to the Greek Proverb - 'Self-control makes the man. A man without discipline is a boy full of reactions, rather than a man of good actions'.



Karl used a graph to illustrate the different patterns of maturation between boys and girls. Boys require some form of initiation, training, or mentoring from a male role model around the ages 13-14 which can result in a steep jump in maturity. Karl spoke of the initiation he undertook with his sons which involved leaving them alone in the bush for 5 days every month over a 12-month period. The boys are presented with a ceremonial knife which indicates that you are now a man who can provide for your community.
