


Is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

Guest Speaker

Our guest speaker for this evening Mr Derek Smith will talk about the Vinh Son Orphanages, Vietnam and was introduced by Mr Tim McKee.

Mr McKee spoke extensively about Derek's long military history in the Australian Defence Force and his passion in helping the people of Vietnam were he did three tours during the Vietnam war.

Mr Smith moved straight into the presentation as he didn't need to cover off again on who he was, by the fantastic introduction by Tim McKee.

The Vinh Son orphanages and local tribes (Jeh) Montagnard ethnic groups, about 55 in total in the Kontum area.

The orphanage children range from 0 - 18 years of age mostly with no known family background.

The Plei Klau well project has been going since 2004, to provide suitable drinking water to all villages. Derek is in the process his 9th well project which should commence in September 2025.

The local village has a kindergarten, but other facilities need constant repair. All previous well's dug have used local labour and normally are dug to depths of 90 to 120 metres.

Each well costs around \$9000 to construct and needs further funding to meet that target.

Derek did mention, that Rotary Clubs of Australia are great supporters of previous well projects in the Kontum province .

At the conclusion of the presentation, Derek took questions from the group.

Jim Morrison delivered the Vote of Thanks.
