
Is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

Jim Morrison delivered the Introduction.


Frana – Bee North, Townsville and District Beekeepers Association.

Frana is the president of the Beekeeper Association, in the role since last year. A love of botany and geology.




Frana presenting to the members.

The Associate has about 400 members and been around for over 40 years. They do presentations across many sectors to educate people about bees, hives and all things beekeeping.



Recently engaged in community work finding grants to give native beehives to community organisations such as kindergarten which would otherwise be unable to afford a hive.





Frana explained a range of aspect of the beekeeping world.

- Bee Classes Worker, Drone and Queen
- Only female bees have stingers.
- Queen is the only reproductive female in the colony.
- Life cycle of a Bee.

- There are many breed/species of bees. While all European bees, there are many branches.
- Queen bees live around 7 years, laying several eggs per day.
- If a Queen Bee becomes infertile and remains in the hive, her offspring will kill here.
- Technology has enabled for a complex process of artificial insemination, to ensure hive remain productive.
- Drone (males) bees are not issued with a stinger, but rather an appendage known as an endophallus.
- When the Drone ejaculates, he blasts with such force that his torso explodes and his dies for his efforts.
- The worker bees are female and the most productive.
- Worker Bees clean, feed and build within the hive.
 In 6 weeks of life, she will do 3000 kms of flying.
- Bees wax is produced by Worker Bees via their bellies. It takes 7 kilos of honey to produce 1 kilo of wax.
- The waggle dance is the way the bees communicate to one another about the honey source – sending a message to others on direction and distance.
- People should plant anything native to assist bees and their healthy lives and honey production.
- Bees have 8 brains, main in their head and then 7 down the bottom part of their body. In a worker has their final brain in her stinger – which is barbed to stay and continue pumping fluid into the victim.
