## Speaker District Governor Kevin Forgeson

Kevin has been a solicitor for over 35 years. Alongside his wife Dianne, they have run a successful legal practice in Te Kuiti for the past 30 years. He has been the Chairman of many community organisations, including Game On Trust, New Zealand Rugby League Central Zone Board and Te Kuiti High School as well as being a trustee for Te Kuiti Community House for the past 27 years. He has been a member of Te Kuiti Rotary since 1990 and has been President three times and held many other positions within the club. He held the position of Assistant District Governor for Area 2 for 4 years.



Kevin was Chairman of Rotary Youth Exchange for District 9930. Kevin and Dianne have two adult daughters, Rachel, and Patrice. Rachel is a qualified solicitor but works as a frontline police officer and Patrice has a Masters in Health Psychology and currently works for the Minster of Health. In his spare time, Kevin is an avid West Tigers supporter and MotoGP fan.

Kevin gave us a number of suggestions on ways of maintaining and improving the running of our club. He says that Rotarians are able to support investment in their people which creates in turn a measurable and enduring economic improvement in the lives of many in their communities. Rotarians are people of action who have the power to improve communities and economic outcomes within those communities.
