### Five Minute Talk from Lynley Ackerley

Lynley recalled two life experiences linked to geothermal activity. As a teenager in Rotorua their thermally heated home had had a steam box (old concrete wash tub made by her mother), from which came one of her favourite meals, oxtail stew.

The second experience was on a tour in Ethiopia with 15 Kiwis. Visiting the <u>Dalloi Sulphur Pools</u> in the Danikal Depression involved a 2 hour walk in extreme heat. Six of the party ignored the strong advice to take plenty of water and use it to avoid heat stroke. They payed a heavy price by collapsing and having to be rescued.
