We sent Katikati College student **Daisy Bryant** to Germany. Now we are fulfilling our return obligation to **Rotary International** by hosting **Julius Lange**, who most of you will have met (or at least seen) at our meetings.

This is a <u>serious</u> Club responsibility!

I have phoned most of you and inquired about your willingness to host Julius for a month or whatever time might suit. (I have not contacted those members where distance from Katikati, or age and health issues were going to be an obvious impediment) This process has yielded only 2 hosts.

To remind you:

- Julius arrived in September 2024. John and Jean Bothwell hosted him until Labour Weekend
- Meredith Ahearn hosted him from Labour Weekend until 10 th November
- Julius was away in the South Island from 10 th − 20 th November
- Moira and I hosted him from 20 th November until 31 st January
- Julius is currently with Jim and Mary Bremner until the end of February
- Anne and David Owen will host him in March

We MUST find hosts for Julius for the 14 weeks from APRIL until he leaves us on JULY 7.

If you feel, on reflection, that **you <u>can</u>** host Julius, I ask you to <u>contact me</u> urgently. <u>Please don't assume</u> others will **step up**. May I say, Julius is delightful company and willing to try new things.

If this <u>final</u> plea to the Club is not successful, and our Rotary Community cannot host Julius, we will need to seek a <u>family from</u> the College community <u>and this will come at a <u>cost</u> to us, financial and reputational.</u>

Brien gave us an appreciation (including photos) of of the four properties he has lived in during the 47 years he has run orchards around Katikati.

He and Moira moved into the area at a 6 ha kiwifruit orchard in Tuapiro Rd in



1977. It was a simple cottage near a dairy runoff property owned by our past member Ian Noble.

Nine years (and a young family) later they built a new house there before selling out in 1989 to move to an 8ha property with 2ha of kiwifruit on Sedgemoor Lane (off Tetley Rd). With 4 young children major alterations/additions were required.

After 13 years there the family moved (in 2002) to their last orchard block on Walker Rd West, then a 4ha paddock with a pine shelterbelt and a huge pine tree on the house site. Here Moira established the garden (photo above) of her dreams and eventually ?ha of avocados were planted. In addition to these properties a holiday home at Kinloch was rapidly erected (in 2 months) before snow was experienced there in 2011. Brien and Moira are about to retire from orcharding to Omokoroa.

In Memory of another prominent Kiwi Rotarian

BIII Boyd — Rotary International President 2006-7

The passing of Bill Boyd was commemorated at a service in Pakuranga on 30th January. He was an esteemed and much-loved member of the Rotary Club of Pakuranga and past Rotary International President 2006-7.

Bill and his wife Lorna were known and loved throughout the Rotary world. Among his many international positions held were, NZ Polio Committee member, International PolioPlus Task Force and Committee member, Chair of the Rotary Foundation and Rotary International Treasurer.

However, his Rotary career spanned over 50 years beginning as a member of the Rotary Club of Wellington North in 1971 from whence he became District Governor in D-994 in 1983. His transfer to Auckland came about through his extensive career with Gordon and Gotch. He joined Pakuranga in 1985.

Among his many accolades received throughout his career were the awarding of The Queens Service Order in 2007 and the New Zealand Order of Merit in 2013. Throughout his careers, Bill was ably supported by his wife Lorna, who in her own right gained a reputation for her international skills and support of Rotary ideals.

Apart from the many and rich personal memories Rotarians and friends will have of Bill, is the legacy left by the Bill and Lorna Boyd Charitable Trust, which has so far purchased and had distributed through Rotary Clubs over 220,000 illustrated dictionaries to children in decile 1, year 4 schools throughout the country. The remaining trustees are committed to the objects of the Trust which is also a perpetual memory to one of Rotary's finest servants.

Members of Katikati Rotary Club will remember that Bill Boyd was guest speaker at our 50th anniversary on 21st February 2021. Rotarians will need little reminder of what a wonderful man, club member and contributor to Rotary on the world stage that Bill was.
