# Member's Talk by Rod Calver

Rod offered us a second instalment in his life story covering the 30 year period from 1967 university days at Massey in Palmerston North until he joined Katikati Rotary in 1995. He enjoyed summer jobs in a bush singlet gaining a deep tan in river valleys including Waitaki in the south and Whangaehu in the north.

Graduating with an agricultural science degree specialising in agricultural engineering he was employed as a government farm advisor based in New Plymouth working on subsidised schemes to improve water reticulation on farms. During this period he further upskilled with a post-graduate degree in agricultural engineering at Lincoln.

In the late 1970s dairy farms in this region started to be converted to grow kiwi fruit, with suitable land fetching an unheard-of \$1,000 per acre. When he moved to this area in 1978 the trains still ran through Katikati. They settled on the harbour edge at Matahui Road, close to where power lines crossed over to Matakana Island. Cream was transported from the island by horse and dray and stock were droved across to the yards near their house.

Mangroves were sparse 45 years ago. 10 years later the power lines were removed and the electricity went underground. Often riding over to the island they became close friends with the Ngatai family. Rod won awards for his kiwi fruit growing and eventually became President of the growers association (later evolving into Zespri, with which he is still associated today). Maryanne purchased her Lindemann Road farm in 1990 and the orchard was sold in 1997. Rod began his close friendship with Alan Dawson, taking a job at his growing Aongatete pack house. Rod was a Lions Club member for many years (President 1983-84) before joining Rotary in 1995.
