Consonus Vokalensemble Concert

On Sunday 28 July our Club put on an event at the Katikati Town Hall that will be remembered by the some 150 that attended for many years. The visiting 25 strong champion choir from Switzerland, the *Consonus Vokalensemble*, put on a spectacular hour and a half concert unlike most that Katikati has experienced before. The choir were touring the North Island after winning two gold medals at the recent World Choir Games in Auckland.

The concert was preceded by a delicious dinner catered by <u>Bay Caterering</u> and a dozen young <u>Leos</u> from Katikati delivered food to table and cleared it away before the concert. Then the incredibly talented group took us on a journey to the Swiss Alps with love songs sung in Romansch, Italian and Swiss German, a wedding song from Slovakia and so much more.
