Days for Girls International is an awardwinning NGO that works to shatter stigma and limitations associated with menstruation, for improved health, education and livelihood outcomes. It was founded in Kenya in 2008. More than 500 million people worldwide do not have what they need to manage their periods. Because of this many schoolgirls feel unable to attend school.

The Days for Girls (DfG) Pad is a washable, reusable, beautiful menstrual health product that's built to last. Pads are made by volunteer sewing teams. 915 Chapters and Teams and 125 Clubs made and distributed 156,373 DfG Kits in 2020 focusing on Refugees, Internally Displaced Persons and those most in need.

At the end of 2020 Days for Girls has reached more than 2 million women and girls in 144 countries on 6 continents with quality, sustainable menstrual care solutions and health education.
