

# Grants Criteria Checklist

## District 9930

N.B. The success of a club in obtaining a grant and what proportion of their request will be made available will depend on how well they meet the following criteria:

### **MANDATORY CRITERIA**

- All dues fully paid up
- MOU signed
- Completion of Grants Management Seminar through the Learning Centre
- Club Foundation Goals entered on My Rotary
- Club President appointed or President Elect confirmed for each year of grant project.
- Maximum amount available is the lesser of \$5k or half of project cost.

**Applications can only be considered if all mandatory criteria are met.**

### **CRITERIA**

- Aligns to TRF Areas of Focus, Aims, Objectives and Mission
- Adheres to principles of the Four Way Test?
- Club is a regular TRF supporter
- The project is financially sustainable, particularly when there are non-Rotary partners involved.
- The project can still proceed if the full amount requested is not awarded?
- Applicant Club has considered supply chain issues and cost increases.
- The purpose of the requested grant aligns with the current Rotary International theme
- The project maximises Club member involvement based on % of club members.
- The project is novel, exciting and eye catching and Provides excellent Media and PR Opportunities
- Makes a significant difference in the Club's local and/or international community and meets a genuine community need.
- Partners with other Rotary Clubs within NZ and overseas
- President Elect(s) should have attended SPPEDS and District Training.

Preference may be given to those clubs who are currently struggling in terms of membership and those who have rarely, if ever applied for a District Grant.
