The booth is located at the Raley's/Target shopping center at 1925 Douglas Blvd. Please go to our www.signup.com to see what ours to volunteer are available.

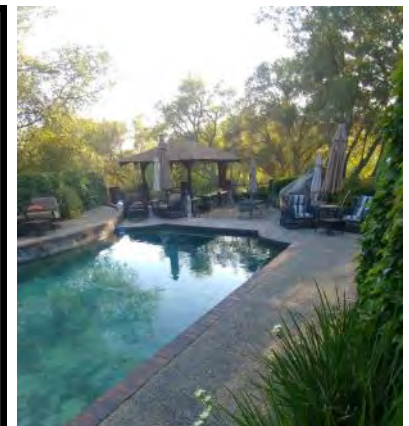

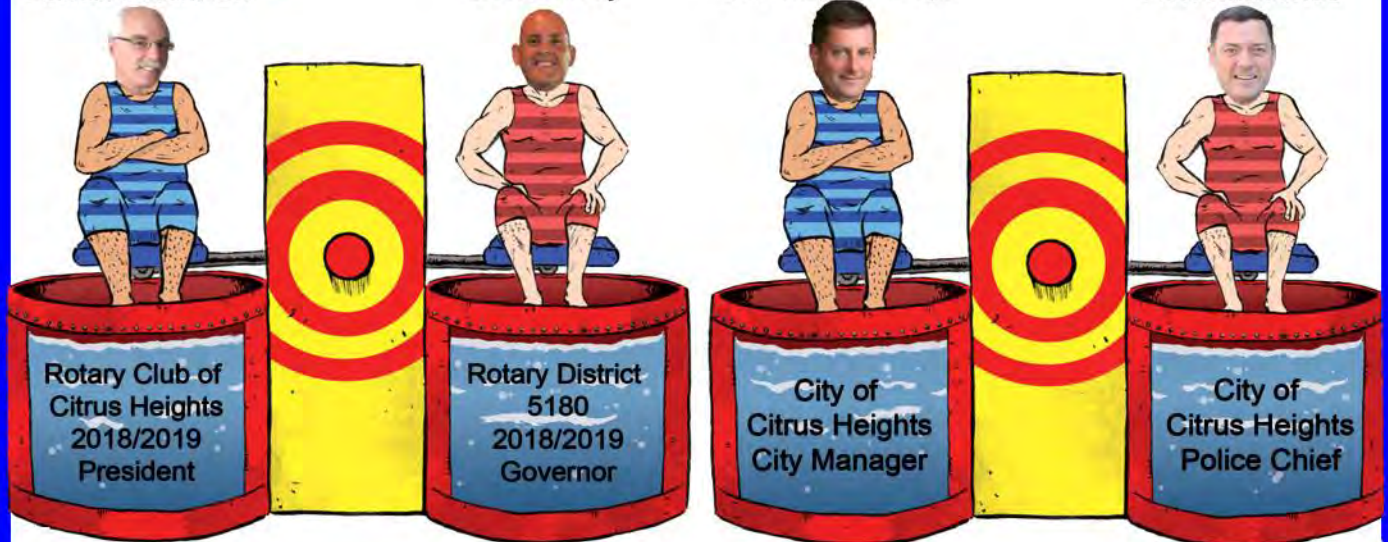
