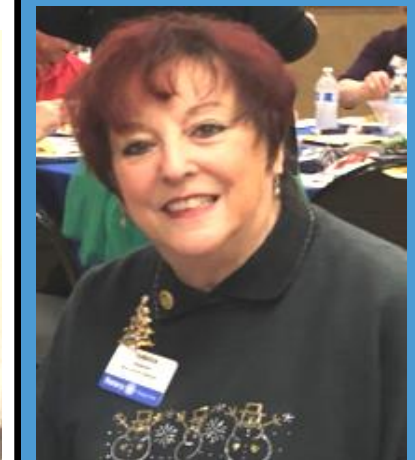
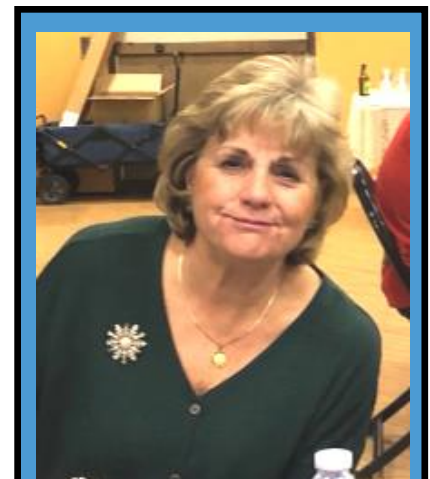
PASSPORT ONE HELPS FIRE VICTIMS

The Tanzanite, Zircon and Turquoise**



The name "Tanzanite" reflects the gem's limited geographic origin which is the Northern portion of Tanzania. It was not discovered in commercial quantities until the 1960's. It is the second most popular blue gem after the sapphire.



The Zircon is a colorful gem with high refraction and fire that is unfairly confused with the cubic Zirconia. It is a gemstone of many colors, and is a historical gemstone used for thousands of years.



Turquoise is found in its natural state in places with dry climates throughout the world. For nearly thousands of years, Native Americans have mined and fashioned Turquoise. They have used it to guard their burial sites.

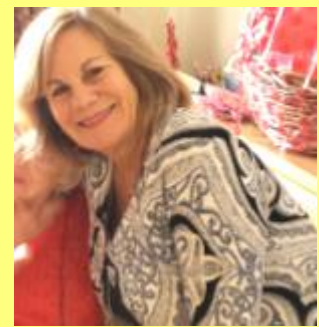
