March is Clean Water and Sanitation Month

Clean water, sanitation and hygiene are basic necessities for a healthy environment and a productive life. When people have access to clean water and sanitation, waterborne diseases decrease, children stay healthier and attend school more regularly, and mothers can spend less time carrying water and more time helping their families.

At least 3,000 children die each day from diarrheal and diseases caused by unsafe water. That statistic is a grim reminder for Rotary members, because providing clean water and sanitation is a priority for us. While very few people die of thirst, millions die from preventable waterborne diseases which is why Rotarians promote clean water initiatives in underdeveloped countries. We also teach these countries to maintain new infrastructure, and organize educational projects to promote hand washing and other good hygiene habits. Many clubs in our district have received district and global grants to water filtration projects.

The world focuses on clean water every year on March 22nd.

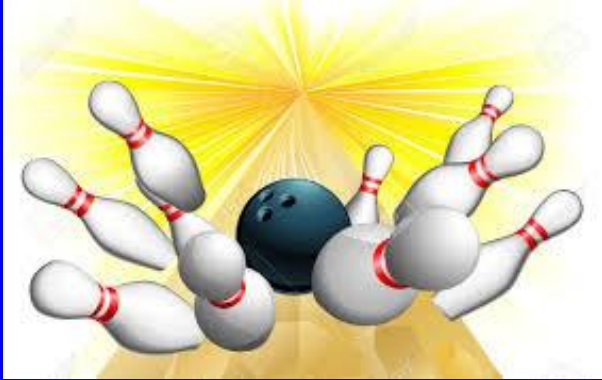
March Birthstone is the Aquamarine
