Those who cannot read are isolated from information. There are 775 million people over the age of 15 in the world who cannot read. That equates to 17% of the world's population who are illiterate.

In the United States this statistic is not much better. We have 14% of our citizens who cannot read, and 21% who cannot read above a 5th grade level.

Illiteracy has become a crisis in the world. Rotary has made education one of the six area of focus for our Foundation. There are many district and global grants available to clubs who want to get involved.

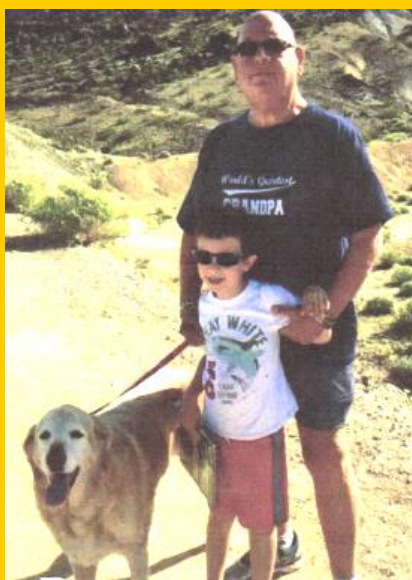
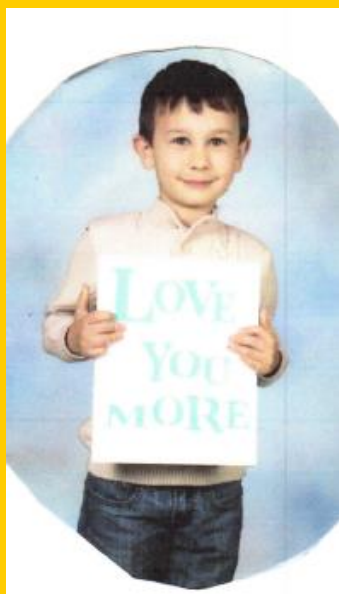
