Nearly 1.4 billion employed people live on less than \$1.25 a day. In an effort to change this statistic, Rotarians promote economic and community development. Last year the Rotary

Foundation spent 9.2 million dollars to grow local economies. Rotary members train people to become resources in their communities offering networking activities, advice on new business development and financial management training.

There has been success in **breaking the cycle of poverty for women**. As an example: Most of the women in rural Guatemala do not have collateral to receive loans from financial institutions. The Rotary club of Guatemala de la Ermita helped 400 women obtain financial literacy courses so they could pool their money and fund their own microlending company.

Rotarians in various parts of the world are **teaching farmers to extend their growing season** and help the residents eat healthier, local food.
