



Brief history of eClubs

1996 RI opened its first home pages

2001 RI initiated a program to study new forms of rotary clubs

- Rotary eClub of District 5450 chartered on 1.1.2002
- 2004 an eClub Pilot program was launched with 14 clubs
- 2010 Council of Legislation to review the success of the pilot and how to continue
- the eClubs were approved as a form of Rotary, initial limitation max 2 clubs per District, either as fully internet based or hybrid (meeting also physically
- 2013 Council of Legislation
- The limitation of 2 clubs per district was removed
- 2014 spring situation
- 145 eClubs: USA 24, India 18, Brazil 12, S-Korea 11, Taiwan 8, Japan 6, Australia 5, Germany 5, Thailand 4, the rest in 35 countries with 1-3 clubs in each
- 2015 spring situation https://www.rotary.org/en/search/club-finder/e-clubs?all=1
- 220 eClubs: USA 31, India 27, Brazil 17, S-Korea 21, Taiwan 19, Japan 10, Australia 7, Germany 8, Thailand 7, Italy 8, Philippines 6, Argentina 4..
- 36 in Europe in 15 countries (of which 16 in Germany and Italy)

Rotary E-Club 2410 SE

- First Swedish E-Club, Chartered 2012
- Pure E-Club, almost only online
- Today: 54 members, 50/50 gender split.
- Age range 23-93
- Open to Swedish speaking members regardless of geographical locaion
 - From Luleå in the north to Lisbon in South
 - Most outside of Sweden are expats who still want to be member of a Swedish club.



Meetings

- Weekly meeting "always on" 24/7
 - lecture by video clip
 - Popular as makeup meeting for Swe rotarians
- Monthy Skype meeting
 - Live meeting with one lecturer and discussion
- Face-2-Face meetings 2 times / year
- Groups in Facebook, LinkedIn etc.



Projects

- Water focus
 - In 2012-13 part of Global Grant project in Jordan
- Fundraising through visitors
 - More than \$100 per capita to TRF Annual Program
 Fund
- Rotary Day online, social media
 - World Water Day, March 22
- Members also active in local club projects

Rotary eClub One of Denmark

Three ways to stay a member of Rotary E-Club One of Denmark wherever you may be or if time is too tight to take part in the Skype meeting three weeks every month

- 1. Club meetings using Skype/webcam.
- Discussion Forum based on the minutes and in some cases video from the previous Skype meeting.
- 3. eMakeUp articles both in Danish and English.



The start of the Danish e-club

- Founded on the chassis of a closing morning club in 2013 with an initial membership of only two Rotaria and three non-Rotarians. Chartered in June of 2013.
- An express way to get recognition from Rotary International.

(But other than that, it may be a very bad idea).

- The start-up of the Danish e-club was based upon an idea of the District Governor Elect (2012-13).
- The club was given the name Rotary E-Club of District 1480.
- The first year of our existence as a recognized Rotary Club we managed to reach 11 members - some Rotarians from other clubs, the rest recruited externally.



The first year's activities

 Skype meetings with invited speakers, most of whom from outside Rotary. Rotary E-Club One of Denmark

- The Coffee Club. Based upon a bylaw paragraph, money was collected on a voluntary basis for an international project (The Water Survival Box).
- External speakers were invited to become guest members.
- Some accepted the invitation, but only one person from this category is still a member of the e-club today.

When E-Club of District 1480 became Rotary E-Club One of Denmark



- In June of 2014, Rotary E-Club of District 1480 was re-named Rotary E-Club One of Denmark with the approval of Rotary International, the chair of the Danish Rotary Council (an IPDG) and our own District Governor.
- The purpose of the name-change was to signal to the Danish Rotary milieu that we do not foresee that there is room for more than just one e-club in Denmark for a good many years to come.

With Greenland in focus



- In late 2014 the e-club was invited to join a North Atlantic project sponsored by the Copenhagen area district 1470 vis-à-vis Greenland.
- In addition to a number of local projects at various locations in Greenland, a second aim of the project is to use the Danish e-club as a potential gathering place in Cyberspace for new or old Rotarians from Greenland.

The one and only e-club in Denmark



- In January of 2015 the Executive Committee of the Danish Rotary Council – consisting of the five District Governors – declared their joint support for the one and only Danish e-club.
- In marts of 2015 the chair of the Danish Rotary Council, an IPDG, suggested that the e-club perhaps should be moved from its current district (1480) to becoming the responsibility of the council, if a major administrative change were to be approved by Rotary International.
- In Marts of 2015 Rotary E-Club One of Denmark opened its very own website, www.rotaryeclubonedenmark.com.
- . . . but we also use the official national Danish Rotary site, www.rotarynet.dk.
- Our current membership hovers around the 10 members' mark.
 We have three members living abroad. One in France, one in Norway and one in Hong Kong.






How many Rotary clubs and how many Rotarians are there in Turkey?





- Cultivating olive, cherry and grapes






What do we do/plan for Damlacık?

We organize an e-certificate program for human resources management training

- It is a charge-free program open to young people looking for jobs in human resources departments
- It consists of 4-hour courses lasting for 10 weeks
- Trainers are professionals in human resources field who are volunteered to take part in the project
- After completion of courses, trainees take an exam and if they are successful, they recieve a certificate.
- This year 5 students have recieved certificate.

Rotary eClub of Verkkorotary.fi



- One of the 14 initial pilot clubs, chartered in 2004 as 4th in the world, 1st in Europe
- From the very beginning "hybrid", with one terra per month, otherwise weekly online meeting. Online meetings initially in Centra, then Adobe Connect, occasional trials with other technologies
- Good visibility & support from the D1420 and Finnish Rotary. Even now 2 former DGs still participate our meetings on regular basis.
- Eight persons from the charter members had previous Rotary background and the rest sixteen were new Rotarians, although many of them had previous background of Rotaract.

Verkkorotary meetings



- Weekly meeting on Adobe Connect Pro
- "Standard" 1 hour meeting format:
 - President's opening + official matters
 - Members tell of their highlights of the week
 - Online presentation+ discussion (either by member or person outside the club), the presentations are usually recorded, so those not online can view later for makeups
- Terra meetings with various activities: outdoors, museums, company visits, etc: to get to know each other & build fellowship
 - Sometimes with online participation allowed, when feasible

- Over the years, there have been many who resigned, but new members were recruited. Currently 9 charter members
- Ages distributed very evenly from 35 to 75
- 80 % living in the Helsinki metropolitan area/D1420

Verkkorotary's activities



- Participation in youth exchange programs
- Supporting funding of the audio book devices to senior homes, new Children's hospital, Shelter boxes, Namibia project, etc.
- Fund raising by e.g. selling tickets to theatre performances, concerts etc.
- Cooperation in service projects & joint meetings with other Rotary Clubs in the district
- Active participation in the District and Finnish Rotary level:
 - Chairing Finland's Rotary and District IT Committee
 - Chairing District Communications Committee
 - Participation in District Youth Exchange Committee
 - Assistant Governors

An active "Rotary club as usual", however, not needing to go into a physical meeting every week, as participation can be done online (or even offline) from anywhere.
