



The Rotary Foundation

This year, the District has raised over \$150,000 in the form of donations from clubs and individuals.

An Evening with Jennifer Jones in November was jointly hosted by DG Dick Wilson (D9520) and I at the Military and Naval Club to launch Our Rotary Legacy.

Ian Riseley, Rotary International President Nominee and RI Past President Bill Boyd were our guest speakers at a special Foundation Dinner in May. On the night, 17 bequests totalling \$637,000 were recognised.

The work of the Foundation is funded by the donations Rotarians and others make individually or as a Club directly to the Foundation. Remember that 50% of those donations come back to the District every three years in the form of Grants. Please make your first charity, our own Charity, The Rotary Foundation.

Grants: A total of 18 successful District Grants to the value of \$47,000 were awarded by the Grants Committee to a great variety of projects that included Health, Community Development, Water & Sanitation and Education. Congratulations to you all.

The Rotary Clubs of Adelaide and Prospect together with the Rotary Clubs of Waling Waling Davao and East Davao are continuing their work on a Global Grant for a project in the Philippines.

Polio Eradication

We are winning the war! We are 99% of the way to a polio-free world. Yes! We're truly, "this close" to eradicating polio forever. There are just 17 known cases remaining. Help us get closer by spreading the word. Now is the time to give it our best effort to reach our goal of a polio free world by 2018.

Rotary Community Corps

We introduced the concept of the Rotary Community Corps (RCCs) which work in partnership with Rotary clubs to improve their communities. Each RCC is sponsored by a Rotary club and, as with Rotaract and Interact clubs, the Rotary club acts as its partner in service

Rotaract/Interact

RC of Pt Pirie has established an Interact Club, now up and running, and the final paperwork has been submitted to Charter the club. The three clubs in Alice Springs are looking to set up an Interact club. The RC's of Mawson Lakes and Gawler are each in the planning stages to form new Rotaract clubs.



A Training weekend was conducted on the 18th and 19th of June at Emmaus Campsite at Halbury near Balaklava. There were 28 participants including a Rotaractor from Ballina in northern New South Wales. Several speakers for the training sessions included outgoing Adelaide City club President Kirsti Kankunnen and Rotarian Rick Henke.




District Change Over
