

But a happy surprise was that our newest member but far from a stranger to Rotary - **Duncan Rutherford** - came to his first meeting with us and was able to be our 'Guest Speaker'! He gave a brief outline of his younger days, his pleasure and gratification in being a Rotarian and then very interesting details of the company ARC Reo in which he has a managerial role. *Welcome Duncan!*



Also at last week's meeting, *proposed activities for our Rotary area* (emanating from a previous meeting of club leaders) were outlined to members. The resulting thoughts of our Club members were taken to a follow up meeting of club leaders on Friday. The ideas, comments of other clubs and some outcomes of this meeting will be mentioned tonight if time permits. Thank you to **Phil Peckman** for representing our Club and coordinating these discussions.

<u>A reminder to all</u> – Our Mega Meat Raffle (an important fundraiser for our club) will be on again this Saturday from 2pm to 4pm at the Charles Hotel. It's only once a month and outside in the beer garden is very pleasant with the added bonus of a sausage sizzle! Where else would you want to be??

President Rose

Tonight's guest speaker - Nicolle Richards

Nicolle has worked in the community services sector for 12 years and she has a deep commitment to supporting marginalised communities, those affected by mental health, substance misuse and family and domestic violence.

Her career began as a community development worker; she then moved on to work in adult mental health prior to a short stint in housing and homelessness providing front line support to the most marginalised and disadvantaged; i.e. the rough sleepers.

Nicolle now works for Women Illawarra within the Illawarra Women's Domestic Violence Court Advocacy Program providing support to women and families directly affected by family and domestic violence.

Phil Peckman will formally introduce Nicolle & extend a vote of thanks after her presentation.

Last week's meeting minutes: Scribe – Janet Crakanthorp

↓ Janet Crakanthorp's reflection highlighted that women were not permitted to join a Rotary club in the United States until 1989. International efforts to include women began as early as 1912, but the constitution was changed in 1921 to explicitly restrict membership to men. The Duarte, California club inducted two women in 1977, but R.I. revoked their charter in 1978. A 10 year legal battle ensued resulting in the US Supreme Court stating that "women cannot be excluded". The 1989 Council on Legislation vote to admit women into Rotary clubs worldwide remains a watershed moment in the history of Rotary. So boys, without women where would West Wollongong Rotary Club be!

- ♣ Michael Crowley's international toast was to the Rotary Club of London, United Kingdom, which was chartered in August 1912 and was the first acknowledged Rotary club outside North America and is listed as Club No. 50 in Rotary International.
- ▶ **Duncan Rutherford** (pictured right), who is our Club's newest member, was in the spotlight tonight as our impromptu guest speaker. Duncan started by thanking the members of our Club for accepting his membership and went on to stress how difficult it was for him to return the Charter of the Rotary Club of Kembla.

He went on to say that while he received numerous emails from other clubs wanting him to join, Duncan also received an email from our **President Rose** thanking him for all his work within Rotary without a request to join – that was when he decided West Wollongong was the Club he would like to join! Rose was also his teacher in high school.



Duncan lives in and works out of Wollongong in the steel industry for Australian Reinforcing Company (ARC), a business that is very passionate about continuous improvement, safety for the environment and staff. Mental health of its staff is also greatly valued within the company.

While acknowledging the steel industry is one of the biggest greenhouse gas producers in the world, ARC sources the steel required to manufacture their products from Whyalla GREENSTEEL (part of GFG Alliance) as their steel-making process uses magnetite iron ore low carbon steel-making technology. The group plans to become carbon neutral by 2030. The Whyalla blast furnace was removed and replaced with a more technologically advanced Italian designed furnace at a cost of \$160M. The power source for the Whyalla operations will be sourced from wind farms throughout South Australia thus eliminating 90% of the use of fossil fuels.

Duncan spoke highly of the work undertaken by Rotary and his passion to remain involved. To quote Duncan... "Without Rotary and the support of my wife I would not be here.

Apart from initially welcoming Duncan to our Club, President Rose also thanked him for graciously agreeing to be our guest speaker for the evening and providing an interesting 'off-the-cuff' presentation.



- ♣ Past President Phil Peckman attended a meeting in relation to the new Rotary Community Group Action Plan to discuss how we move forward and to what extent we become involved. Phil led the discussion on how to support the Plan and fit in with the seven other clubs. Four main topics covered included:
 - 1. Illawarra Community Domestic Violence Project;
 - 2. Mental health;
 - 3. Environment; and
 - 4. Youth and Education.

It was decided that further coordination and communication was required before our Club commits to more than we can handle. Members decided to continue the support in the way we do now.

- Phil went on to announce:
 - A collection bin for Escabags is now in place at Southern IML Pathology
 (Kristy (pictured right) from Southern IML Pathology with one of the Escabags'
 collection bins).
 - Combined Rotary Clubs of the Illawarra Charity Race Day Organisers are still looking for additional guests to participate on the day. 236 tickets have been sold; however, at least 250 are needed. Our Club has booked four tables of 10. Also, donations for the silent auction and bottles of wine for the wine fridge are still being sought. Please let Phil know if you can help!
