- Helen's reflection was inspired by recent events in Beruit. She and husband, Saleh, drove there from Amman, Jordan via Damascus in April 1975 to visit the nearest Australian Embassy at the time. Encountering roadblocks on the way they were advised not to go into the Beirut CBD. Locals said that when a member of one of the local factions had been shot and his group had retaliated by blowing up a bus full of those, they thought responsible but it turned out it was another group entirely. This misunderstanding was the start of the Lebanese Civil war that lasted 15 years, killing 150,000 people. Inspired by senseless events like this, we toasted the Rotary focus on "Peace Building and Conflict Prevention".
- ♣ Annette gave the international toast the Rotary Club of Paris formed in 1921 and who have a Nobel prize winner as a member.
- **▶ Dennis** announced that the 'Jag the Joker' jackpot at The Charles Hotel went off to someone who had never been before, came by accident and did not realise how the numbers worked.
- ♣ Rose announced progress on next year's Paws 4a Cause and asked for volunteers to help get prizes for the raffle. Anticipated date is Sunday 6 April 2025.
