



Meeting minutes from last week: Scribe - Marilyn Phillips


- Meeting was opened by Sergeant Patrick Roberts at 6:15pm.
- ♣ Patrick introduced President Rose Pope who welcomed all members and guest, Dr Steve Andersen, and our guest speakers Greg Knight, Peter and Denise Aubourg.
- ♣ Reflection was given by Marilyn Phillips. On this day in 1935 Parker Brothers launched the board game Monopoly. It was actually created in 1905 in the USA by left-winged feminist Lizzie Magie as a way to demonstrate that an economy rewarding individuals is better than one where monopolies hold all the wealth. It is played in 113 countries and printed in 46 languages; we even have a Vegemite edition.
- ♣ International toast was given by Marilyn Phillips on behalf of Ken Potter, who is currently holidaying in Venice. The international toast is to the Rotary Club of Venezia. They meet at the Hotel Monaco Grand Canal, Venice on the 4th Wednesday of the month.
- Birthdays and anniversaries were announced by SGT Patrick.
- Reports
- ♣ Helen Hasan attended a Zoom meeting with other Illawarra District clubs; information is on the Rotary District Website. Helen reminded us Purple Friday is every Friday to raise awareness for domestic violence.
 T-shirts are available from Helen for \$8.50 each. A walk is being held at 10am on 30 November from the Light House to Kiama, details on the District website as well as in the attached flyer.
- Kids Teaching Kids Day is on Friday 29 November and will be run by Joshua Swinton from the Permaculture Living Classroom.
- **▶ Dennis Simpson** reminded everyone about the *Kembla Grange BBQ on Sunday*. There are still some vacancies in the roster.
- ♣ Noel Watt gave a *Treasurers' report on the Charles Hotel for Thursday and Saturday results*. Also, the *MS Gong results from last Sunday BBQ*, run with the assistance of **Corrimal Rotary Club**. Rose thanked Corrimal Club for their assistance on Sunday.
- **Phil Peckman** announced there had been no objections to **Ros Yeoman's** application for membership.
- **♣ Greg Knight** introduced himself and began by thanking Rotary for all the community work Rotary does.





- Greg presented his work towards forwarding electricity in the Illawarra area, which will eventually lower the cost and help save the planet. Electrifying your home and vehicle will save the average Australian household over \$3,000 every year while reducing household emissions close to zero.

- The idea is to replace our appliances gradually over a number of years as we need to renew them. Start with going Solar. Make sure your roof is in good condition before installing Solar. Always buy more than needed at the present time and get multiple quotes. Install some west facing panels if possible and if you have partial shade compensate with more panels. Look for systems with control options such as a timer so you can use your solar energy.



- Payback time is usually 3-5 years and during the lifetime of the panels the cost is 3 cents/kilowatt and it makes you resilient to power rises. Improve the insulation and seal gaps in your home to reduce heating and cooling bills. Run your electric appliances during the day to maximise savings. Always buy a quality Invertor. Check with your electrician to see if you need a switchboard update.
- Reverse Cycle air-conditioning is 3-4 times more efficient than a standard electric or gas heater.
- Greg presented the Club with some handouts, one in particular showing cost and savings for electric cars and bikes. Greg also presented some costings and savings for space heaters, water heaters, vehicles and cooktops over the years. He also mentioned a number of websites available to assist members.



- Greg spent a long period answering questions from the floor.
- **John Erickson** (pictured above right with Greg) thanked the speaker and his associates and presented Greg with a Rotary Club pen.

President Rose announced:

- The 7News NSW and ACT Community Awards presentation;
- MS Gong ride last Sunday;

- The Board agreed to fund *Liam Bulman* who has an aggressive cancer with money to purchase an electric wheelchair;
- *Illawarra RYDA (Rotary Youth Driver Awareness)* has received a <u>grant from IMB Society</u> to support the program;
- Anyone with old phones please donate them to Rose who will forward them to be wiped clean and given to victims of domestic violence;



The Rotary Clubs of the Illawarra are organising a walk to raise awareness of the impact of Domestic and Family Violence on our community. This is part of a Rotary Multi National Campaign.

WHEN

Starting 10am on 30 November 2024

We will walk from Kiama Lighthouse and return to Kiama Lighthouse. The walk is approximately 2.1 kilometres. There is an incline down for the start of the walk and uphill to the finish. A water station will be available halfway and toilets. A map of the of the walk is on the reverse side.

On completion of the walk there will be presentations on the impact of domestic violence by leaders in domestic violence and by local police. Seating will be available and resources on domestic violence by local agencies.

WHY

In Australia, Domestic and Family Violence is disturbingly common.

It is one of the drivers of homelessness among women, children, and men. Domestic and Family Violence crosses all boundaries, race, age, financial status, education, gender, and the suburb you may live in.

1 in 6 women and 1 in 16 men have experienced physical or sexual violence by a current or former partner. Alarmingly, on average 1 woman a week and 1 man a month is killed by a current or former partner (AlHW, Family Domestic and Sexual Violence Australia 2018).



Many victims of Domestic and Family Violence will never report their experience. With many incidents unreported, Domestic and Family Violence may be much worse than we think.
