

A report from Di North on the Rotary International Zone 8 Conference

The Rotary International Zone 8 Conference was held in Queenstown from 1 to 3 November. 300 Rotarians from all around Australia, New Zealand and Pacific Islands gathered to hear some great guest speakers. Raj Gautum from the Rotary Club of Kathmandu, Nepal, gave a presentation on Empowering Communities. Our Club has previously supported Raj and the Rotary Club of Kathmandu to build toilets in schools in Nepal. Other guest speakers were Cat Levine speaking on the mental health issues she had with her daughter and how they successfully got to the other side and are now helping others, and Melissa Vining, who founded the Southland Charity Hospital after her husband died of Pancreatic cancer. There were also updates on Regionalisation.

There was a special dinner with *Past Rotary International President Mark Maloney (2019-20)* and his wife, Gay, with some of the other District Governors from that year.

The Rotary International President for 2025-26, Mario Cesar Martins de Camargo attended the conference as well as the new Zone 8 Director, Gim Bok Chew from Singapore. All of these people were so willing to stop and have a chat.

Saturday afternoon was spent doing various activities. There was packing of items into handbags for homeless women, an End Polio walk, and the weeding of Wilding Pines, which is a pest and displaces natural flora and fauna in New Zealand. Rotarian Jonathan Usher was one of the MCs and kept everyone entertained with his amazing magic tricks.



The Rotary Clubs of the Illawarra are organising a walk to raise awareness of the impact of Domestic and Family Violence on our community. This is part of a Rotary Multi National Campaign.

WHEN

Starting 10am on 30 November 2024

We will walk from Kiama Lighthouse and return to Kiama Lighthouse. The walk is approximately 2.1 kilometres. There is an incline down for the start of the walk and uphill to the finish. A water station will be available halfway and toilets. A map of the of the walk is on the reverse side.

On completion of the walk there will be presentations on the impact of domestic violence by leaders in domestic violence and by local police. Seating will be available and resources on domestic violence by local agencies.

WHY

In Australia, Domestic and Family Violence is disturbingly common.

It is one of the drivers of homelessness among women, children, and men. Domestic and Family Violence crosses all boundaries, race, age, financial status, education, gender, and the suburb you may live in.

1 in 6 women and 1 in 16 men have experienced physical or sexual violence by a current or former partner. Alarmingly, on average 1 woman a week and 1 man a month is killed by a current or former partner (AlHW, Family Domestic and Sexual Violence Australia 2018).




Many victims of Domestic and Family Violence will never report their experience. With many incidents unreported, Domestic and Family Violence may be much worse than we think.
