VALE: Kathleen Adele Chaplin A Life of Love, Adventure, and Wisdom

Kathleen Adele Chaplin (Adele to all who knew her) passed away peacefully on 27 November at the age of 91.

Adele was the beloved wife of Past President John Chaplin OAM, who passed away in 2018. Together, they shared a life full of love, adventure and mutual respect. Adele's love for travel was evident in the many journeys they took together, exploring new cultures and cuisines around the world.

A voracious reader, Adele found great comfort and joy in her extensive library, especially after John's passing. She was also an enthusiastic supporter of the West Wollongong Rotary Club for many years, where her wit, humour and wisdom made her a cherished companion. She never failed to attend the awarding of the John Chaplin Memorial Scholarship. Meeting minutes from last week: Scribe - Di North

The meeting opened with Sergeant Di North welcoming special guests ARH/RCWW 60th Anniversary PhD Research Scholar Thanapon Deekaikam, his supervisor at the University of Wollongong (UOW), Professor Mirella Dottori, and our ARH indigenous Scholar, Maddie Lawson.

- The reflection was given by Sergeant Di North, who reflected on a quote from Germany Kent. "Take time to reflect on how much you have. It may not be all that you want, but remember someone, somewhere is dreaming to have what you have".
- The *international toast*, given by **Dennis Simpson**, was in honour of our PhD Scholar Thanapon Deekaikam, who was born in Thailand. The **Rotary Club of Bangkok** was the first Rotary Club in Thailand.

Board announcements:

President Rose Pope:

- At the *District Presidents' Meeting* on 28 November, Rose was presented with *two awards for our Club* from the Rotary Foundation for our Club's Foundation giving.
- On Friday 29 November, Rose and Janet Crakanthorp represented our Club at the Australian Rotary Health (ARH) Indigenous Scholars dinner.
- Rose said there are *14 awards to be presented to local schools at school assemblies* over the next couple of weeks. She thanked those members who volunteered to present them.
- Helen Hasan: Purple t-shirts are available to purchase, through the website, for the Walk against Domestic Violence and Purple Fridays. <u>They cost \$8.50 each</u>.
- Noel Watt: Last Thursday night's Charles Hotel Jackpot Raffle revenue result was comparatively low; however, the Club did receive a significant donation from the Charles Hotel, representing monies from the Saturday Sausage Sizzle.
- Michael Crowley then introduced our scholars:

Thanapon Deekaikam, our Australian Rotary Health (ARH) PhD Research Scholar, spoke about his home in Thailand, but said he was really enjoying his life in Wollongong. Thanapon received a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Chiang Mai University in 2018. In 2021, he completed his master's degree in Polymer Science at Chulalongkorn University in Thailand. He contributed to the invention of natural polymer structures capable of responding to external stimuli for targeted drug delivery. Thanapon wants to expand scientific knowledge of polymers for medical applications. He aims to develop new artificial skin for people with sensory impairments. He is working on human mechanosensory neurons which are specialised nerve cells that allow us to feel touch, pressure, temperature and pain. Examples of neurological disorders where these neurons are not functioning properly include Parkinsons Disease, Peripheral Neuropathy and spinal cord injuries. Early diagnosis of nerve related disorders is important to improve a person's overall quality of life. The biggest challenge in his research is the lack of realistic tissue models. The existing models do not replicate the complexity of human tissues. *Thanapon acknowledged the work done by Mitchell St Clair Glover on 3D tissue models*.

A video was played from our *John Chaplin Memorial Scholar*, **Nicholas Fantham**, who gave his apologies for not being able to attend. He comes from Bega and is well acquainted with Rotary, having participated in the Safe Drivers' Course. The research Nicholas is undertaking is to look at organic synthesis in order to manufacture antibacterials. <u>We will have the opportunity to see Nicholas when he visits our club on 12</u> <u>March 2025</u>.

Maddy Lawson, our *ARH Indigenous Scholar*, is a proud Ngemba woman. She is currently living and working in Sydney. Maddy completed a Bachelor of Public Health at the University of Wollongong in 2021 and is now studying for a Master of Public Health Degree. Maddy is currently working for NSW Health in the Infectious Diseases Team. She is working on the sepsis awareness campaign, the annual influenza campaign and the new RSV maternal vaccine rollout.

Maddy has written papers on such things as "Policy reform to protect children from unhealthy food marketing in Australia", and "Policy reform to improve ACCHO funding allocations" (Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation).

Maddy is also researching women and their HIV risk. The challenges she has discovered for these women getting treatment are access, stigma, education and lack of targeted intervention.

Michael Crowley thanked Thanapon & Maddy for telling us about their studies and they have both promised to return to give further updates.
