We had a great turnout of members, friends, partners and guests at last week's 60th Anniversary & Changeover Dinner at The Basement within The Builders Club in what transpired to be a very enjoyable evening from a number of viewpoints.

For the benefit of those who were unable to participate, some highlights follow along with a few photos:

- ♣ President Phil Peckman (at the time) outlined his 2023-2024 report ... details of which can be found in our Club's Annual Report HERE.
- As part of our 60th Anniversary celebrations the Club agreed to support another Australian Rotary Health PhD Research Scholar over the ensuing 3-3.5 years. Phil was in a position last Wednesday to formally announce details of the successful applicant, notwithstanding the research project and scholarship do not officially commence until July. An excerpt from Phil's address in relation to our new scholar is appended below:

"Club members are well aware that we have supported youth, education and research over many years and tonight I have the pleasure in announcing that the successful applicant of the Australian Rotary Health/Rotary Club of West Wollongong 60th Anniversary PhD Research Scholarship commencing in July 2024 is Thanapon Deekaikam, an international student from Thailand who will undertake his PhD research work at the Intelligent Polymer Institute, Faculty of Engineering and Information Services, University of Wollongong over the next 3-3.5 years.

Thanapon completed his master's degree in Polymer Science at Chulalongkorn University, Thailand, in 2021. He holds a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Chiang Mai University, which he received in 2018. Additionally, Thanapon gained experience in researching bio-based plastics for practical applications in daily life while pursuing his master's degree – so he possesses real-world experience in addition to academic knowledge. Thanapon's interest lies in studying biomedical applications impacting on a wide range of people and medical ailments and his proposed research aims to develop new artificial skin that can significantly improve the quality of life for individuals with sensory impairments.

He is passionate about making a tangible difference in people's lives. Thanapon is dedicated to advancing scientific potential and pushing the boundaries of biomedical research by his commitment to expanding scientific knowledge of polymers for medical applications.

Our Club will invite Thanapon along with our other supported scholars to one of our meetings in the coming months to meet members/friends and to provide us with more detail in respect to his research plans."

While still holding the Club's reigns as President, Phil went on to *induct our newest member*, **Dr Kevin**Wanambiro (pictured below with Rose & Phil):



Kevin is a Radiologist, originally from Kenya and has lived & worked in the Netherlands prior to making Australia his home. Kevin became an Australian Citizen at our Club's Annual Citizenship Ceremony last month.

We warmly welcome Kevin Wanambiro and his partner Dalphne Osoro to the Rotary Club of West Wollongong family.

Noel Watt (pictured right) reflected on our Club's past 60 years with some interesting statistical analysis of membership, highlights of projects adopted and fundraising generated throughout our 60 year history.
