With patience and wonderful communication skills these young people can see the the light at the end of the tunnel

Jon also spoke about some of the costs involved in running the programs - HUGE, and also about the money donated to Op Flinders from The Rotary club of Mt Barker, including the \$5000.00 donation that was pledged that night. The water filtration tanks were discussed and how that has made a huge difference to the water available to everyone on camp
