

### PRESIDENT SALLY WILLOUGHBY'S CHANGEOVER SPEECH

Good evening Rotarians, Rotaractors, Distinguished guests, family & friends.

Are you having a good time? I am very proud to be the 44<sup>th</sup> President of the Rotary Club of Mobilong.

But, this was never meant to be, not on my agenda, not in my wildest dreams...

But desperate times call for desperate measures.

We'd weathered difficult times during Covid & other disruptions, but where PP Bronwyn held us together for 2 years with strong and stoic leadership.

In Bronwyn's 2<sup>nd</sup> year however, there was no-one to follow her. This went on for months, until one of our astute members came up with a succession plan. He said he would stand for President, if 2 others put their hands up to follow.

Unprepared as I am with no leadership experience, One of those was me.

Of course I only did this because of how strongly I feel about Rotary and how positively I feel about this Club.

I was rather fearful, but P Bob re-assured me by saying. There have been worse people than you when they started. Importantly though he also said that the members would give me all the help & support I needed. And they have and they do. We are like family. This is my second family.

I have been a Rotary member since 2015 and it is a joy to be with and work with like minded people who put service above self to work tirelessly to raise funds to help others, and we also look out for each other, which generates friendship, goodwill & well-being.

Though a very small cog in the Rotary wheel, collectively we make such a difference and give hope to so many in the world.

With so many disasters, tragedies, catastrophes, man made & from nature, in the world today, it has never been a more telling time for us a Rotarians to 'Create Hope in the World" I'd now like to cross to RI Gordon McInally.... *(video)* 

where RI talks about woman in Thailand, & the beautiful shell giving her hopes

On your tables you will see the shell-shaped vases filled with colourful orchids (representing the colours of the world). These vases are for you to take home if you wish.

In this year, apart from the ongoing projects we have, we are going to focus on the following areas:

#### Mental health

A directive from our RI President Gordon, who has a personal reason – losing his adult brother (a highly successful accomplished individual) to suicide.

One in 5 adults between the ages of 18 & 65 will suffer some form of mental health issue.

I too have a personal interest – 6 members of my extended family have suffered, or are suffering from mental health disorders – from mild to serious.

We want to raise awareness & lift the stigma associated with mental health.

#### The next area of focus is Domestic & Family Violence

This is an insidious & mostly hidden (underground) scourge in our society.

Grant Stevens, SA Police Commissioner recently said at the National Council for Women "we could spend all our time working on domestic violence, and nothing else"

We too in our family, have witnessed a form of Domestic Violence - co-ercive control. That person is a survivor.

Under District Governor Craig Dowling's directive, We are joining with other clubs to address this alarming situation. We say NO to Domestic Violence.

Another area of focus is Internationally:-

We want to apply for a Global Grant from the Rotary Foundation to help fund the work of Dr John Willoughby OAM through his Vision of Islands charity. John provides eye surgery to remove cataracts from young & old islanders who would otherwise be blind.

John provides his surgical skills free of charge, but there are other huge costs to be borne in continuing this impactful work on an on-going basis.

#### And the 4<sup>th</sup> area of focus is our Youth.

After all, our future is in their hands. And we know that young people are passionate about issues locally & world wide. They care about our planet, saving our environment etc. Apart from the enrichment camps Rypen & Ryla we send a few young people to every year, we want to reach out to all young people in our community and district, offering them hope & prospects for their future, as well as working on projects of their choosing to help those in need. One way to reach them is to help them establish their own Rotaract Club, under their own constitution & working independently from us, though of course under our guidance if needed. By working for others, they in turn will experience personal development, and career opportunities will come their way. I should explain - For those of you who are not familiar with Rotaract, simply put, it is Rotary for the young – from age 18 to 40

There are actually 5 Rotaract Clubs in SA, the Adelaide Uni Club having around 80 members. Worldwide there are over 200,000 Rotarators. They are all truly people of action.

I am very pleased to have some Rotaractors here tonight – Lucy Kopp from Adelaide City & who has been the Rotaract District Representative, Ruby Wilson and Nova Ward from the Salisbury Rotaract Club, with Ruby being co-president of that Club.

These Rotaractors bode well for the future of Rotary.

And finally, I want to announce a competition for our Youth. To write a song for Rotary which has world-wide appeal but with an Australian slant.

A song which is joyful and rousing and captures the spirit of Rotary.

And there will be a monetary reward for the winner.

To sum up, I am looking forward to getting on with the job, working with my Board and all our members. Already this last week, our team has been hard at work catering for 4 events.

I also look forward to joining and working with other Clubs - West Lakes, Edwardstown, Tailem Bend to name a few, and of course MB.

I look forward to working with you President Gordon of the MB Club. After all, we are your 'daughter' club as pointed out to me by your PP Kevin Prosser.

I also point out that anyone at any time is welcome to join us. We are simply a bunch of volunteers working to make a difference & Create Hope in the World.

I will presently introduce my Board and come back later to do my Thankyous.
