I have just returned from one of Murray Bridge's premier events – The annual Pedal Prix where our members and friends were kept busy cooking on our BBQ trailer and our donut caravan.

The event is held over a weekend at Sturt Reserve and attracts many visitors, and is where state and interstate students compete in a 24 hour non-stop race in their custom built pedal cars. The weather was perfect and the event was enjoyed by one and all.

Last week we heard the devastating news of the earthquake in Morocco where over 2,100 lives were lost and many are homeless. Thankfully, Rotary is deploying Shelter Boxes (temporary housing) to those affected. The Shelter Box programme was started by Rotarians in Cornwall, UK, and since 2000, has provided over 2 million shelter boxes worldwide to those in need. It was timely then, that Rtn Peter Jarvis (Past President of the Berri Rotary Club) was due to give a talk on Shelter Boxes – a campaign he is passionate about and which he is heavily involved. Our Club donates funds to purchase shelter boxes, and the 'donation box' Peter handed around at our meeting yielded petty cash funds toward purchasing a shelter kit, which is a kit providing tools and utensils for a shelter box.

Our International project is progressing. Please see the DG's article in this Bulletin, or read it in his latest District Newsletter (eNews).

Also, soon we hope to partner with a South Pacific Rotary Club to be able to apply for a Global Grant.

I look forward to hearing Julie Barrie at our meeting this Wednesday 20 September where she will be talking on the "Pangarinda Botanic Garden". This promises to be most enjoyable.

I hope you can join me on Wednesday.



ROTARY CLUB OF MOBILONG INTERNATIONAL PROJECT

Can you help restore sight to people in our neighbouring Pacific nations?

Vision of Islands is a non-profit volunteer eye surgical and clinical team, providing free-of-charge cataract removal for South Pacific Islanders (of all ages) who would otherwise be blind. To date the team, led by ophthalmologist Dr John Willoughby OAM, has worked in Tonga and Tuvalu.

The Rotary Club of Mobilong seeks financial support from clubs in District 9510 to allow Dr Willoughby and his team to continue and extend this work.

Vision of Islands operates under the direction of the Ministry of Health of each participating country. Their medical outreach team trains the local medical staff in patient care. They provide medical and teaching equipment and train local staff in their use, as well as extend specialist eye services to remote areas where people lack specialist services because of remoteness.

The team provides all the equipment, expendables and teaching materials (with backup). They remove all their refuse, leaving the island as clean or cleaner than on arrival

Their goal is to include Registrar trainees from Australasia in the program to expose them to aspects of humanitarian care where they will also see extreme need and advanced pathology. They also aim to take other professionals who may wish to serve or study topics covering several island nations.

Their first volunteer trip back to the Pacific Islands since the Covid-19 Pandemic is now underway. On this trip Dr Willoughby and his team will treat hundreds of patients in the island nation of Tuvalu.

Dr Willoughby provides his surgical skills free of charge. But there are other huge ongoing overheads like travel costs, medical equipment, transport and mobile facilities to reach remote clinics.
